

At a meeting of the Gecseytown Fire company Friday evening the following officers to serve during 1929 were elected: President, Oscar L. Theis; vice president, G. R. Stiffler; secretary, A. D. Garner; treasurer, H. L. Felker; fire chief, Guy H. Slippey. The audit of the books of the company showed all bills paid and a balance in the treasurer's hands of \$16.05. Five new members were added to the company's list. It was decided at this meeting to purchase some additional equipment, principally chemical extinguishers, the secretary being requested to get prices on same. It was also suggested that a festival by the ladies' auxiliary be held in the near future for the purpose of raising funds to help meet the expense of the new apparatus. Dean W. Hileman, W. Earl Bico and H. L. Felker were appointed as a finance committee for the year.

Charter Is Granted.

Judge Patterson this morning granted a charter of incorporation to the Geeseytown Community Fire company. It is stated in the charter that the company is organized for the fighting of real estate improvement fires. There are twenty-four subscribers and the trustees are George R. Stiffler, Archer D. Garner, O. L. Theis, John N. Duffy, Grant McClellan and H. L. Felker.

GEESEYTOWN

At the monthly meeting of members of the Geeseytown Community Fire company on Monday evening, it was decided to purchase a lot and erect thereon a suitable building in which to keep the fire equipment. Several sites were offered, the company taking option on the lot at the corner of Broad avenue and Elizabeth street. Committees were appointed to arrange for the building material, plans and specifications. A committee was also named to confer with the Frankstown Fire company, relative to the organization of a volunteer fireman's protective association. The fire chief and directors will, in the near future, give a demonstration of their new equipment. Nominations for the various offices for 1930 were made at this meeting, with the election to be held at the next regular meeting.
