Your Hometown Church Faithful to Tradition Loving in Fellowship Reaching for Tomorrow

My mother owns a camp outside of Dubois, PA where my family likes to visit in the summer for weekend getaways and of course during hunting season. It isn't too far from Parker Dam which has proven to be a great place to take the kids to play on the sandy beach. For the past few years I have been maintaining the outside, mowing the grass, clearing fallen trees, etc., but since my father got sick the inside has been largely neglected. As a result there are a number of projects that have built up over time that are now requiring my brother and I's attentions. In particular the bathroom is in desperate need of a makeover. The cold winter nights and dirt and dust of time have led to a drippy faucet, a dilapidated shower, and commode that is only partially attached to the floor. Had proper care and maintenance been done for the past six years, none of these would be a big deal, but now it is turning into quite a project due to neglect. This reminds me of our spiritual gifts, abilities, and other gifts from God. If we cease using them, they begin to erode and deteriorate, much like the camp. If we do not continue to hon our skills and spiritual gifts we will inevitably lose them. In the parable of the talents found in Matthew 25:14-30 we learn how God entrusts three people with special gifts to be used for the glory of God. Some of those servants use those gifts for God's purposes and glory, subsequently doubling that which they were first entrusted with. One hides the gift, keeping it stuffed away where no one can see it or benefit from it. When the master comes back that one is stripped of the gift they had been given and cast away. The lesson is clear, we should use the gifts God gives us for the glory and kingdom of God. Of course, we do not always use our God given gifts. There are two main excuses that I hear most frequently as to why people are unwilling to serve in the various opportunities the church offers for service to God. The first is the refrain, "I'm too busy"; and I get it, we are all busy. I sometimes

wonder about priorities, but I know lives are busy and volunteering at the church can seem like a big

commitment.

Never-the-less there are always ways to get involved, even for those with limited availability. The second excuse I hear most often is this, "I've been there and done that, my time of helping is past". I sympathize with this mindset because in American culture we value the idea of retirement, of working for a time so that one can enjoy the fruits of their labors. The problem is that retirement is not a biblical concept. We don't get to stop being Christians or stop serving God when we reach a certain age. Indeed the work of Christ continues! It is okay to step aside to provide opportunities to others, it is great to train and help younger generations to take up the mantle passed from saints of old, but it is not okay to hide the gifts of God in an inner vault where they can wither and decay.

We all have gifts and abilities given to us by God. We must use those gifts, tend to them, nurture them, maintain them; or we will lose them and worse lose our connection to God. This month I invite you to consider what gifts you have that are not being used for the glory of God. Maybe you have a talent for working with children, great we can use more volunteers. Maybe your gift is musical in nature, great we can use volunteers. Maybe you have a gift for numbers and business sense, great we can use volunteers. Maybe you can bake or cook, great we can use volunteers. There are countless ways and opportunities to use the gifts God has entrusted to you for God's glory, but you have to use them! Neglecting the gifts of God will only lead to their demise. And the bigger problem with that is not the loss of a particular gift, it is the loss of heightened relationship with Christ that will be missed. Like everything, our gifts must be tended to, otherwise you'll end up with a broken faith that will require more effort to fix than it would have been to maintain and grow. Don't end up with a dilapidated camp bathroom kind of faith! Use it, use your gifts! Trust in God! Serve God now! Serve God always!


