Leadership Team Report

The Team's January devotions were based on the beneficence of God and why and how often we may be taking His blessings for granted. Sometimes it's because we trust in the presence of something – or someone – or rely on the existence or the unseen promise of a certain set of conditions. Too many times in life we fall back on cold logic, the power of human reason, or best-case expectation when we should be looking to the guidance and will of God. Many times we believe we did something without remembering that it was actually the doing of our watchful, caring, and provisioning Father. We were asked to think about some things in our lives that, though our initial impulse is to think of them as the joyful outcome of pure circumstance, are, at the very core, blessings from the Lord of us all. We have been gifted with good health and the resilience to return to it when we momentarily lose part of it. We have kept jobs, maintained means, and enjoyed pleasant social balances in very trying times. We have seen great progress, and have often played a part in making it possible. We have something when we might have had nothing. We have so much to be thankful for, and so much to be in awe of – and God has managed it all, birthing it solely out of His love for us. Is that a beautiful thing to keep in your heart, or what?

Here are some things that the Team recently learned in connection with our post-fire restoration:

The church is now under contract for the security system, the audio-visual system, and the pews and chairs that are to be installed in the renovated Bethany. New tables and chairs for the refurbished fellowship area are being studied. Bids for them are coming in to the architect.

The old flooring in the church will be removed. Hopefully, the resulting lumber can be sold, which will help offset the cost of the new floor. We do have a lead on a purchaser.

During the latest phases of the construction work it was discovered that the north and south walls of the main sanctuary are slightly different heights, which will require remediation through new concrete leveling before trusses for roofing can be put up. The trusses are already being made.

Trustees Report

We've put 2020 in the rear view mirror. Although it was a crazy year with the pandemic and the political upheaval, after a big drop early in the pandemic, the financial markets rebounded quite well. Here is the quarterly report of the financial assets of the Trustees. The following balances (rounded) are as of December 31 (unless noted otherwise):

- Hudock Capital Group (Pershing) \$601,621 an increase of \$48,884 from the last quarter.
- Hudock Capital Group (Pershing) Fire Insurance Fund \$332,703 which only increased \$8 in the last quarter. These funds are invested in secure government backed treasuries which are currently gaining very little interest.
- Prudential Investments \$683,916 an increase of \$54,696 from the last quarter this is our 'in lieu of flood insurance' account.
- Prudential Investments The Raudenbush Trust \$98,900 an increase of \$1,877 from last quarter.
- Prudential Investments \$8,663 an increase of \$575 from the last quarter
- BNY Mellon The Butler Trust \$230,088 an increase of \$20,233 which includes the quarterly disbursement of \$2,625 which helps with current expenses.
- Milton Savings Bank Fire Restoration Fund Current Balance (Jan. 5) \$2,442,337 a decrease of \$168,633 from the last quarter. This is the account that the majority of the insurance settlement and any donations went into and all expenses related to the rebuilding of the church are being drawn from.
