Dear friends and members at MUP,

Earlier this year if you experienced worship at Mars U P Church, (either in-person or virtually by way of our live Facebook feed (or later in the week by way of our YouTube channel or Facebook page), you heard me speak about four spiritual disciplines to nurture our spirits.

They were: 1. Worship, 2. Bible reading/study, 3. prayer and 4. spiritual discernment. Those weekly disciplines/ practices continue to be even MORE VITAL to our spiritual health as this pandemic continues and our sense of isolation and separation from others becomes more and more oppressive.

That is why during the season of Lent we at MUP have recommended that you use the devotional tool "praying the scriptures" for daily reading and reflection. Hopefully this will remind all of us daily that God still loves us, cares for us and will provide for us the strength we need to see us through. Each Sunday hardcopies of that devotional for the week are available for you to take home and use. (Digital copies have already been emailed to our mailing list.")

Also since we are not hosting the "Lenten Luncheons" this year, our worship committee has chosen to post "Views from the Pews – Reflections on the Lord's Prayer" each week on our Facebook page. The videos will be presented weekly by members of our congregation. You are invited to check the site (links are on our church website) watch the brief video and then do your own reflecting. (note: details about Maundy Thursday / Good Friday and Easter Sunday are still being worked out. More info to come later.)

On the next page, is a new hymn that can be sung to familiar tunes. It captures the sorrowful and grievous spirit of our day and it challenges people of faith to <u>be a healing presence</u> wherever we are.

New Hymn: WE GRIEVE 500,000 (Covid deaths in the USA) to tune of ("Lead On O King Eternal", or "Stand Up, Stand Up for Jesus".)

We grieve 500,000 — yet we can't understand; we cannot grasp how many have died throughout this land. We cannot see their faces or hear the stories told of all the ways they blessed us — the young ones and the old.

O God, we grieve the struggle of those who died alone — so far from friends and neighbors, from all they'd ever known. We grieve for precious people who could not say good-bye; we weep for those, now mourning, who sit alone and cry.

O God, we grieve for millions who now are unemployed who cannot feed their families — whose hope has been destroyed. We grieve that needed workers must worry for their health while some with lives of privilege stay home and build their wealth.
