
The legendary Parish Planning meeting is coming back. We will gather after the service **today** to make plans and cheer on projects for our parish family. Bring your ideas and calendars!!

Wednesday Morning Book Study

Our wonderful discussions of Anne Lamott's *Traveling Mercies* will be coming to an end on May 18. We had originally thought we would just discuss one chapter but some of them were small enough that we doubled up and will now be at the end.

We will be meeting on Wednesday, May 18 at 10 AM either in the Parish Hall or on Zoom. This week we had one on Zoom and 9 in person. We provide the Zoom option each week and you click on the link at the

The two things were discussed in great detail on May 11 was what "barn raising" can do for people who are in great stress, grief, shock, etc. The people in Anne's story were parents whose 2 year old little girl was diagnosed with Cystic Fibrosis. The parents were literally immobilized by sadness and shock. Their friends started doing all the mundane things of life like walking the dog, grocery shopping, cleaning the house, etc. It freed the parents to shoulder all the other parts of their horrendous plight. One person in our group had experienced both the barn raising for her and her being able to pass it on to someone else who needed this support. It was a wonderful discussion.

The second thing we discussed in great detail was finding out from Anne's writings how the mind of an addict works. Her writing was very humorous but it was eye-opening as well.

Our reading assignment for May 18 is Parts 6 and 75, from page 209 to page 272. Our discussions are very important to each of us and we want to be able to spend as much time as needed to cover everything everyone wants/needs to say. So, we will continue our discussions until everything is covered.

We have elected to take the summer off so May 18 will not only mark the end of this book

but the end of our group until September 14. Several people are previewing books about Mother Theresa in case we do not have access to Patsy McGregor's new book. I am closely monitoring the progress of her book but there is no availability date as of yet.


This will be our last Parish News article until late August/early September when we announce our new book.

Madagascar Happenings

At the bottom of this article, you will see a beautiful pendant comprised of a tightly wound fossil shell. This is an Ammonite and dates back about 66 million years ago. These fossils can be found in many places, one where they are very prevalent is Madagascar.

Ammonites were ocean-dwelling mollusks. According to the Natural History Museum's Fossil Invertebrates curator, "the Ammonites were born with tiny shells and, as they grew, they built new chambers onto it. They would move their entire body into a new chamber and seal off their old and now too-small living quarters with walls known as speta." If you are able to look closely at the fossil, you are able to see these chambers.

Thank you to Carol Anderson for finding this fossil and bringing it back to me from one of her trips to New England. If it's from Madagascar, Miriam needs to have it, right.

My friend, Sue Babbs, knew all about the Ammonites and has brought some of these fossils plus some beautiful minerals back from Madagascar. She has made some of the minerals into necklaces which she would like to sell, sending the money on to the Diocese of Toliara. I will be picking up some of these the next time I see Sue and will display them for you. I plan to purchase at least one necklace, I will let you know when I will have them.
