PARISH NURSE NEWS -

Happy New Year to all!

Christmas festivities are winding down, and the cold weather is in full swing! Ice on the ground warrants a little extra caution to prevent slips and falls.

The following are some suggestions to get through this ice-cold month.....

- Walk like a penguin:** Take small, shuffling steps and point your toes slightly outward.
- Use proper footwear.** Use snow grips or shoes with good support.
- Maintain balance:** Bend your knees slightly and keep your center of gravity over your feet.
- Keep hands free:** Keep your hands out of your pockets for balance.
- Use aids:** Use handrails on stairs and sidewalks or use a cane or walking stick with an ice tip for added stability.
- Step out carefully:** When exiting a vehicle swing both legs out and place both feet flat on the ground before standing up.
- Take your time.** Do not rush and pay attention to black ice and avoid slippery areas.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Administrative and Personnel—Session approved Pastor Leanne's compensation package:

Effective salary--\$92,808.24 (includes housing allowance)
Other---\$45,572.10 (includes insurance, pension, continuing ed, SECA)
Total---\$138,380.33

All staff will receive a 4% increase.

Hospitality—The annual meeting will feature a catered meal by “Ole and Otto”.

Proclamation-Christian Education—The registration and van rental for attending the winter youth retreat will be paid for by the committee.

Proclamation-Worship and Music—Special thanks to Josh Stokka and others who helped transition from Ramstad Hall back to the Sanctuary.

Property and Equipment—Until the roof is replaced/repaired, there may be a few leaks from the steeple. The choir pews will be upholstered in January.

Resource Management—Session approved the 2026 budget:

Total Income--\$546,000
Total Expense--\$638,785
Net Income (loss)--\$92,785

Session approved the transfer of the 30% interest from the Merritt Fund from the CCC to be permanently placed in the Capital Improvement Fund. (until it is no longer needed there)
