Sunday Reflection: Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, is the sovereign who rules all creation with unfailing love and perfect peace. Unlike earthly rulers who often govern through power, authority, or fear, Christ reigns from the throne of the Cross—offering forgiveness, mercy, and redemption. His kingdom is not marked by riches, armies, or earthly grandeur; rather, it is built upon the eternal foundations of love, justice, compassion, and hope. In Jesus, we encounter a new

and radiant model of leadership—one that elevates the lowly, listens to the forgotten, and chooses humility over dominance. To proclaim Jesus as King of the Universe is to acknowledge that He is above all created things. The heavens and the earth, the vast galaxies and the smallest living creatures—all exist under His gentle providence. As our King, He knows the silent worries of our hearts, the burdens we carry, and the wounds we hide. He accompanies us through every valley of sorrow and rejoices with us on every mountain of gladness. His reign is not distant or abstract; it touches the intimate details of our daily lives, shaping us with grace and strengthening us with hope.

On this sacred feast, we are invited to place Christ at the very center of our lives. To follow Jesus as our King means choosing kindness over bitterness, forgiveness over resentment, and faithfulness over fear. It means allowing His love to flow through us—reaching those who are hurting, defending what is right and true, and becoming a source of peace for all we meet. As we honor Christ, the King of the Universe, our hearts lift in joyful expectation of the day when He will return in glory, fulfilling His promise of a kingdom of lasting peace and boundless joy. In that blessed moment, heaven and earth will be renewed by His love. Until that day comes, we walk in trust, guided by His wisdom and strengthened by His grace, living as citizens of His eternal kingdom. May Jesus Christ, our King, reign forever in our hearts and lead us ever closer to the heart of God.

Saint of the Week ... St. Catherine of Alexandria

According to the legend of St. Catherine, this young woman converted to Christianity after receiving a vision. At the age of 18, she debated 50 pagan philosophers. Amazed at her wisdom and debating skills, they became Christians—as did about 200 soldiers and members of the emperor's family. All of them were martyred.

Sentenced to be executed on a spiked wheel, Catherine of Alexandria touched the wheel and it shattered. She was beheaded. Centuries later, angels are said to have carried the body of Saint Catherine to a monastery at the foot of Mt. Sinai.

Devotion to her spread as a result of the Crusades. Catherine of Alexandria was invoked as the patroness of students, teachers, librarians and lawyers. Catherine is one of the 14 Holy Helpers, invoked as a protector against sudden death.
