MONTHLY MEETING SUMMARY

On April 21, fifteen Broomfield Spellbinders and Scott Carrico (a "member-in-waiting") gathered at Brunner Farm House for our monthly meeting. With **Julie Toepper** out of town, **Wynn Montgomery** opened the meeting and asked for introductions with answers to the question: *Where was your favorite vacation?* Most of the responses involved Europe--Amsterdam, Belgium, Denmark, England, Ireland, Italy, Paris, Scotland) and Mexico (and Monarch butterflies). The areas in the USA named were Alaska, Disneyland, Las Vegas (for her wedding), and New York City. Considering who was at the meeting, it is not surprising that that each response was a wonderful story explaining the choice. **Karen Green** reported that there was nothing new from the library. **Jan Osburn**, who has been asked by Boulder Valley Spellbinders to handle placement in schools, asked who handles that task for our tellers. **Janis Lievens** will provide Jan with the materials she uses. After several members offered suggestions about how to get into more schools, Wynn suggested that this issue should be addressed by the Steering Committee.

Janis Lievens shared an animated version of "The Frog Who Wanted to be a Singer" (by Linda Goss). **Sandy Hopper**, who was scheduled to be the other storyteller, was unable to attend because of a family emergency. **Kay Landers** volunteered and told "Thunder Cake" (by Patricia Polacco), getting everyone involved in counting the time between lightning and thunder claps. We then took a break for socializing and snacks provided by Sandy and Janis (plus a delicious shortbread baked by Scott). Our guest presenter, Laura Deal, discussed "Reimagining Fairy Tales" and showed us numerous books that are excellent examples of "fractured" classics. Her handout included online links to more examples.

Wynn reminded us that Julie will be emailing teacher surveys the first week of May and asked that we encourage our teachers to fill them out and return them as soon as possible. **Denny Thompson** said the April 15 Spellbinders Annual Meeting was very successful.
