Early on the morning of Saturday February 12th, Troop 78 went to the Chester County Council first aid meet. We left on the bus for our 40 minute trek to Downingtown. When we arrived we deboarded the bus and got our gear out of Mr. D's truck. Then we made our way inside to check in and set up our floorspace for the competition.

The first part of the competition was to take a multiple choice test on first aid. When the competition started, the judge handed us our first problem and we began. We had five minutes to read over the first aid problem and determine how we would treat our patient. Then we had ten minutes to treat the patient followed by five minutes with the judge to talk over our treatment plan and get our score.

The first aid problems went over a lot of different injuries and some were very difficult. Each patrol had four different problems to work on and then they tallied up all the scores



to determine a winner. Troop 78 did extremely well, Stag patrol finished 6th, Rattlesnake and Flying Eagle finished in a tie for second, and winning the whole competition in first place was Moose Patrol. We boarded the bus having had a very successful day.





Matje Farm!

On February 18th at 6:45 PM, the Scouts of Troop 78 set off to Matje farm which is owned by Troop 78 alumnus Mr. Matje. We arrived by bus at the farm at 9:30 PM and had a quick snack before the lights went out at 11:00 PM.

To start off Saturday morning, we cleared a large wood pile and moved it all to an open fire circle to be burned later in the day. After the brush pile had been cleared, Scouts competed in bolt splitting which ended in a close finish between Moose and Rattle-Stag. The Troop then competed in



three-man ski, which was also won by Rattle-Stag. The next competition was tug-of-war on the icy grass. Rattle-Stag brought home the gold once again. Next we competed in sled racing, which was



won very narrowly by the Rattle-Stag patrol. We also competed in chariot racing, which was also won by Rattle-Stag after the shocking disqualification of the Moose patrol. The final competition was the water boiling contest which was won by the Rattle-Stag patrol. However, most surprisingly, was the inventive comeback by the Moose patrol after their fire had died. To secure them second place, to everyone's surprise, Moose salvaged the water and fire from Rattle-Stag to boil the remaining water that they had left.

After the competitions, the Troop enjoyed playing on the frozen lake after it was deemed safe. Later, the boys enjoyed skeet shooting under the supervision of the adult leaders. On

Saturday night, just before Rattle-Stag was supposed to cook dinner, the power went out, forcing the patrol to cook outside in the cold windy weather. After a half hour of suffering in the cold, a dinner of meatball subs with a side of spaghetti and sauce was served. Later Saturday night we concluded the day with our traditional campfire in which there were skits from Flying Eagle and Moose, and a song from the Rattle-Stag. We concluded the night with a snack before bed. That night ended up being the coldest part of the trip, with a temperature of 9° Fahrenheit in the barn.



In the morning we enjoyed a breakfast that was "cooked" by the staff patrol. The breakfast consisted of assorted cereals, bagels, and muffins. After breakfast we started cleaning the grounds. We put out the fire that we had started the previous day and we packed the bus, preparing for the trip home. That is a total of 50 light fixtures replaced!

This upgrade has already paid off with better more effective lighting inside and outside the cabin. More pay off will come in savings on the cost of electricity going forward.

The upgrades cost \$5,000 and we are endeavoring to raise the money to cover this cost.
