### SAINTS FELICITY AND PEPETUA Feast Day March 7

While we hear their names mentioned at every Mass in the list of saints and martyrs we actually know little about them except that they died during the persecutions of the early church due their profession as Christians. But persecution for religious beliefs is not confined to Christians or ancient times. Consider Anne Frank, the Jewish girl who was forced into hiding and later died in the Bergen-Belsen death camp during World War II. Like Perpetua and Felicity she endured hardship, suffering and death because she committed herself to truth, right and belief in God.
