

WHERE DOES YOUR MONEY GO?????

The Initial Offering envelope goes to the general fund to help pay for contribution envelopes.

Regular offering envelopes go to the church general fund.

All loose plate contributions on regular Sundays also go to general fund. Easter also goes into the general fund.

<u>NEW:</u> This year you will notice the offering envelopes only have one option: General Fund. In past years, people found the extra option: "Mission" confusing. This "Mission" option did not go to support the Second Offering, but <u>District</u> Missions. The District Mission, (Camp Okoboji, and Lutheran Family Service offering) will now be taken from the General Fund.

General Fund

Salaries and current expenses are the "General Fund" expenses. They include salaries for pastor, secretary and custodian, church and parsonage maintenance and upkeep, utilities, insurance, worship supplies etc.

Special Offering Envelopes go to Missions – they include: Reformation, Advent, Christmas, Ash Wednesday, Lent Services, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Pentecost, and Thanksgiving. The Children's Christmas Program contributions goes to the Sunday School Department and the Candlelight Service contributions goes to the youth. All loose plate offerings go to Missions on the above holidays.

Special Offering such as Building Fund, Lutheran Witness etc. go to the fund marked on the envelope.

You <u>must</u> use <u>your current year's numbered envelope if you want</u> <u>your contribution recorded for your statements</u>. If you have any questions, please call the office for clarification.

<u>Please note:</u> Hawarden Community Food Pantry, and offerings for the Hansen family, our overseas missionaries, and mission projects of our own LWML, are collected and dispersed separately in the **second offerings.**



Advent Midweek Services

We decorate in preparation for Christmas. In November and December, people spend hours putting up lights in their living space and ornaments on their evergreens. Poinsettias are placed on the mantel, presents are put under the tree, and we deck the halls with boughs of holly. These Christmas decorations bring enjoyment and anticipation to the holiday. Advent is the church season of preparation for Christmas, for the coming of the Lord. This Advent season, as part of our preparation, we will reflect upon three common Christmas decorations and how they help us see Christ and prepare for His coming: evergreens, lights, and the creche. Then, on Christmas, we will focus on the wrapped presents, which point us to the greatest gift of all, Jesus Christ.

Trinity Is becoming a Swaddling Clothes Center!

Donations of children's diapers and wipes are needed to help fill our shelves. The first three weekends in December, there will be a table in the narthex where you can leave packages of diapers (newborn to size 6 or pullups) and/or wipes. If you would rather someone else do the shopping for you, there will be a donation box at the diaper table or you can give Lycia, in the office, a monetary donation.

Over the past year, the members of LWML have talked about how we can reach out into our community and help serve those in need. Trinity received overwhelming community-wide generosity and support through volunteers and donations following our devastating flood in 2024. With gratitude to God for faithful friends and neighbors, there was a desire to give back to our community by using the resources God has given, including restored facilities and grateful hearts and hands.

In October, Julie Mann spoke to the members of LWML about this program. The project took off from there. Becoming a Swaddling Clothes Center allows our congregation a way to answer our Lord's call to love our neighbor in tangible ways by providing diapers to needy families with young children. Our purpose at the Trinity Hawarden Swaddling Clothes Center will be giving of diapers and wipes to those in need. We will also reach out with the Gospel to those who come to our church through personal witness and by inviting them to attend worship and Sunday School.

The center will help those families in need, that have young children, by making diapers and wipes available on the fourth Sunday of each month, beginning January 25, from 3:00-5:00pm.

Sammy Anderson, Kassy Boyer, Amanda Buryanek, Nancy Buryanek and Breanne Noble are serving as the steering committee for this program. It's a dead run until Christmas. Advent seeks to pump the brakes, though. Over the years, however, I've become more and more appreciative of Advent's stalling and braking as Christmas draws near.

In many our culture tries to cheat us out of "real" Christmas by starting Christmas early. As soon as Halloween is over Christmas is in full swing. Holiday music, decorations, Christmas shopping dominates and Thanksgiving becomes, in my opinion, "Christmas Number One" or "First Christmas." I can't decide which I like better. By December 25 we are all flat worn out with Christmas.

Long before "Holly Jolly Christmas" and Bing Crosby dominated the airwaves, Christians set aside the weeks of Advent following November 30 to prepare, to wait, to hope for Christ's coming- both at Christmas and at the end of time. They fasted, prayed, acknowledged and repented of their sins and reflected on how God could come to us in our flesh to save us from our sin. Such reflection also prepared their hearts in faith for Christ's final return in glory to judge the living and the dead bringing an end to sin and death. They used the 12 days of Christmas to really celebrate and feast the birth of the Savior.

I used to fight the decorating, the music, and the gift giving, but now I simply suggest disciplining yourself enough to occasionally and routinely stop, meditate, and pray in among the Christmas forces. Contemplate Christ's return: are you ready? Is there anything you need to change about yourself? What part of your life needs to fall in line with the Ten Commandments? Learn the power of stopping and withholding for your own good and the good of others. Ponder His coming for you at Bethlehem: read the Christmas story from the bible in Luke 2. Think about what this meant for Mary, Joseph, and the shepherds and Wisemen. Come to Advent Midweek services and join with us praying, singing, and preparing. Finally, celebrate Christmas well. I mean really well. Use the 12 days that follow December 25 to rejoice and be merry. Give generously to those in need, especially, to those who don't deserve it.

Pump the brakes in Advent. Stop. Pray. Repent. Then celebrate! Christ is born for you and your forgiveness. He is also coming soon! Amen! Come, Lord Jesus.


