Mayor called the meeting to order at 8:32 am. No public comment. Minutes approved 2-0, 1 abstain (CM Revelle wasn't present at last meeting). Number of referrals this morning are #53-57.

#53 (from CM Suffredin) Evaluate the safety of crosswalks throughout the city with options to make them safer (flags, led markers, etc.) Source of revenue could perhaps be ARP money. Luke Stowe asked why not just have staff do it; why does it need to go to a committee? Because it may require money not previously allocated. Motion to send it to A&PW for discussion by end of 2022. Approved 3-0

#54 (from Stowe) Regulations on use of electric charging stations. For example, how long can you park there. Sent to A&PW for discussion by end of 2022. Approved 3-0

#55 (from CM Kelly) Change in residential parking ordinance. Sent to A&PW for action in first quarter of 2023. Approved 3-0

#56 (from CM Revelle) Similar request to add a residential zone where complaints that many non-residents are parking. Staff is ready to do a postcard survey to determine if indeed residents want such a change. Sent to A&PW by first quarter of 2023 for action. Approved 3-0

#57 (from CM Kelly) Create a better platform (than just spreadsheet) to keep track of issues that the previous City Council didn't pass, but didn't defeat so the new Council can know. There is legislative software, if affordable, that can do that. Question does "icompass" program have that ability? Alison said no. Sent to Rules Committee for discussion in first quarter of 2023. Approved 3-0
