Friday, May 3, 4-7 pm

**Piles of Potatoes** - We'll demonstrate how to grow potatoes in crates. Potatoes will be given out.

Friday, May 17, 4-7 pm

**Berry Happy Strawberries** - Learn how you can grow strawberries in small spaces. Strawberry plants will be provided.

Friday, June 7, 4-7 pm

**All in for Alliums** - Onions and leeks, oh my! Onion sets and leek plants will be shared with interested gardeners.

Friday, June 21, 4-7 pm

**BFFs - Tomatoes and Calendula** - We will focus on companion planting, edible flowers and straw bale gardening! Both tomato plants and calendula will be distributed.

Friday, July 5, 4-7 pm

**Edible Host Plants - Dill, Parsley and Fennel** - Swallowtail butterflies like these host plants AND they are edible. Dill, parsley and fennel plants will be available.

Friday, July 19, 4-7 pm

**Please eat the Flowers - Nasturtiums** - Learn about this edible flower. Nasturtium plants will be distributed.

Friday, August 2, 4-7 pm

**Kool Kohlrabi** - If you have a deep pot you can grow kohlrabi there or in your garden. Kohlrabi plants will be provided.

Friday, August 16, 4-7 pm

**It's Cilantro Time** - Grown in a pot or in the garden, cilantro loves cooler fall weather. Cilantro plants will be available.

Friday, September 6, 4-7 pm

**Radishes X 2** - We will focus on growing radishes in two ways. We'll provide plants for those who want radishes to eat and seeds for those who would like to have radish microgreens for salads.

**Monarch Mania** - It's time to be thinking about milkweed and monarchs! Milkweed seeds will be available so you can grow milkweed and hopefully we'll have monarch caterpillars for you to observe.
