Thank you for supporting Youth Advocate Services (YAS) in 2015. It was a very busy and successful year at YAS!

While we were serving 1,210 kids and families in our three programs, YAS underwent a rigorous national re-accreditation review and state recertification audits. Additionally, throughout 2015, YAS welcomed 25 new foster and adoptive homes to our network.

The Council on Accreditation made a four day long site visit to review our programs and services and ensure high quality standards are being maintained. COA was able to do just that. "We cannot express how impressed we were with this agency," said COA reviewers. It is so well run and provides great services." YAS received praise in many areas, including the following comment: "You are one of the only agencies we have seen that has an actual community-based approach." Our community is of utmost importance and we are grateful for all of our partners that make it possible to serve families in our area. Our re-accreditation was expedited due to zero (0) findings on over 500 service standards. Kuddos to all of the staff for their hard work and effort!

YAS celebrated our successes with our foster and adoptive families through two events this year. The first was in June at our Annual Foster Parent Banquet where we honored those who have become an essential part of the YAS team. We celebrated our families again in December during our Annual Snowflake Festival where guests enjoyed a holiday meal, gifts donated by our community through a giving tree at Pathways— Members 1st Credit Union, holiday movies,

stories, face painting, crafts and pictures with Santa. Additionally, Buckeye Community Health donated hams and turkeys for our families again this year.

Our 5th Annual Youth Advocate Services All-Class Car, Truck & Motorcycle Show, newly dubbed "Wheel-O-Rama" was again presented by Rife's Autobody. This year was our best turnout with 180 vehicles, that's around 700 wheels! This event was again judged a success by sponsors, participants and spectators and helped raise over \$16,000 for the children and families served by our agency. In addition to a car show, YAS held an inaugural poker run which raised nearly \$2,000 and had an incredible turnout it's first year.

The goal of Youth Advocate Services is to continue to make a difference in our community by strengthening families, which are the core of our community. Our vision is to improve every life we serve by putting quality care and customer service above all else. We are so grateful to all of our friends for your support of our efforts promoting

## history

Youth Advocate Services (YAS) is a nationally accredited, state-certified, 501(c)(3), non-profit child/family caring agency who has served thousands of children and families since 1978.

For 38 years, Youth Advocate Services (YAS) has believed in the premise that all children, and especially those who are vulnerable or atrisk, should live in a family-centered, caring and nurturing home. As the oldest therapeutic foster care program in Ohio, YAS has provided high-quality treatment foster care, while working collaboratively with other child serving agencies to develop and implement a community support system for families.

YAS has since grown and is proud to also provide mental health and behavioral health services to children and families through a holistic, wraparound approach as well as coordination services for families with children ages 0-3.




## location

YAS is located at 825 Grandview Avenue, one block north of the Grandview Avenue Exit off of I-670.

The YAS location provides state of the art facilities with a large training space, multiple meeting rooms, a spacious lobby, play room and opportunities for foster parents, children, families and staff to grow and develop. The building also has a private room that is utilized by our licensed psychiatrists to meet with clients confidentially. All of this enables YAS to continue and build on its tradition of serving thousands of children and families in our community each year.

- it is important to **only** use placement as a form of treatment for children and families.






# foster core

# traditional & treatment foster placement

YAS provides family and therapeutic foster care services to youth ages 0-18 in and around the central Ohio region. Foster parents with Youth Advocate Services are specifically trained to provide a safe and therapeutic environment for children and teens of all races, genders and socioeconomic status'. Masters-level licensed clinicians provide ongoing and crisis support to foster parents. Clinicians also deliver homebased counseling and CPST services to foster youth in order to achieve positive outcomes and continued success. Program staff, clinicians, and foster parents work collaboratively with the custodial agencies of youth in care to achieve their case plan goals. Youth Advocate Services actively recruits interested foster/adoptive families in the local community throughout the year. Parents attend Pre-Service training and complete a home-study to become a licensed foster family. YAS offers licensed foster parents monthly on-going training opportunities as well as annual dinners and holiday events.

# adoption

YAS supports those who are interested in adopting by providing the necessary training to prepare them for adoption as well as providing a thorough adoption home study. YAS also provides pre- and post- adoptive counseling as well as respite support to families that are growing their family through adoption.







## community respite

YAS provides respite to at-risk families in the community through our Family Foster Homes as well as our Therapeutic Foster Homes. Through this program, families in our community are able to utilize respite in order to maintain their children in their home in order to prevent their children from being placed in foster care or another higher level of care. YAS provides both short term and long term respite for children and teens.

# help me

The Help Me Grow (HMG) program is designed to ensure Ohio's children receive a healthy birth and the resources to warrant a healthy and productive start in life. An integral part of Ohio's prenatal to age three system of supports, the services offered by Help Me Grow equip parents with the means to help their child acquire the early building blocks necessary for long term success. These initial achievements last a lifetime, as scientific evidence strongly suggests that a child's success is significantly determined by the quality of nurturing in the first three years of life. Help Me Grow encompasses two components: Early Intervention and Home Visiting. Each component strives to ensure that parents receive the individualized care and support needed to live a healthy and happy life.

### early intervention

The Help Me Grow Early Intervention program aims to identify and serve children under the age of three with developmental delays and disabilities. YAS Service Coordinators communicate with parents, doctors, hospitals, child care providers and other community agencies to identify children with existing developmental delays, or those with medical diagnoses with a high probability of delay.

YAS Service Coordinators assist in providing developmental evaluations for children to identify needs and linkage to Early Intervention services if recommended. The Service Coordinators assist families in learning about additional community resources to help meet other needs. Service coordination ensures the Individualized Family Service Plan is complete and up to date. Service Coordinators also provide parent education regarding child development.

## home visiting

The Help Me Grow Home Visiting Program began in July 2010, replacing the old At Risk program. The Home Visiting program provides expectant or new parents with the information, support and encouragement they need through a voluntary, high-quality home visiting service. YAS Home Visitors aim to educate at-risk parents with the resources to understand and capitalize on the optimal early years of a child's life. By supporting the positive interaction with children in stable and stimulating environments, Home Visitors seek to create a sturdy foundation for future achievement. Ultimately, this approach is essential to the educational and economic success of children and families.

### **Smoke-free Families**

YAS HVs will be involved in a Quality Improvement (QI) project that hopes to reduce the prevalence of smoking before, during, and after pregnancy with the implementation of a brief counseling intervention utilizing "5 A's."



The YAS HV Team will also be contributing to a state-wide QI project in order to increase healthy pregnancies and decrease infant mortality.

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

YAS serves children in over 180 schools in Franklin County and surrounding areas by addressing needs that present both in the home and in the school. Referrals often arise out of behavior management issues in the classroom as well as other needs that present as children acclimate to school and other life stressors or changes. Licensed clinicians meet with children and their families as well as school personnel in order to best identify and meet the needs of the client. YAS clinicians strive to empower families to identify their own goals. Together, families and clinicians set goals and celebrate successes large and small. YAS is able to provide individual, family, and group counseling as well as community support and psychiatric services.

The Council on Accreditation (COA) is an international, independent, nonprofit, human service accrediting organization. COA accredits the full continuum of child welfare, behavioral health, and community-based social services.
