



Friday, May 2, 9–11:30 a.m.

The Friday morning program, which is different from Thursday evening in tone and content, *focuses on professionals and families*. Through presentation, experiential exercises and reflection, this program teaches caregivers creative, effective methods for communicating with, connecting with and caring for people with Alzheimer’s and dementia. Combining information about dementia with creative drama, this presentation is designed to deepen awareness of the value of people with Alzheimer’s and dementia, increase understanding of their limits and needs, and improve the delivery of their care. It breathes life into the process of Habilitation Therapy and teaches participants how to implement these recommended skills in order to enhance patient quality of life and reduce caregiver stress. The *objectives* include:

1. Recognize, understand and accept the value of persons with Alzheimer’s and dementia as well as the limitations caused by Alzheimer’s and dementia.
2. Describe how to observe, listen and respond to persons with Alzheimer’s and dementia in ways that preserve and promote self-esteem and improve quality of life.
3. Explain how to reduce conflict, increase cooperation, and relieve stress for persons with Alzheimer’s and dementia and those caring for them.

Alzheimer's disease and how best to respond to it became a passion for Jade as she engaged in care for her mother. She combined that caregiving experience with her pastoral and improv comedy skills to explore communication with those who have Alzheimer's in a new way. In the midst of caring for her mother she founded "Healing Moments™ Alzheimer's/Dementia Education, Advocacy and Ministry." This program won a Best Practices in Adult Ministry award in 2010, from the National Council on Aging's Interfaith Coalition on Aging. She is also the author of the highly praised, *Where Two Worlds Touch: A Spiritual Journey Through Alzheimer's Disease*. This book will be available for purchase at the workshop.



Her education and training include an M.Div. from Harvard University, a Certificate from the Shalem Institute's Spiritual Guidance Program, a Doctor of Ministry in Faith, Health and Spirituality from Andover Newton Theological School, and a diploma from Improv Boston University that deems her "perfectly OK not knowing what in the world is going on!"



Beyond Memory Books: Effective Strategies for Communicating with Persons with Dementia

Michelle S. Bourgeois, PhD, CCC-SLP, Professor, *The Ohio State University*, Columbus, OH.

Visual cues in the form of pictures and sentences have proven effective for enhancing conversation and memory-related behaviors of persons with dementia. Strategies emphasizing the use of written and graphic cues will be described, including the use of memory wallets, memory books, and reminder cards, to modify problem behaviors and to maintain conversation skills, enhancing the overall quality of life of persons with dementia and their caregivers.

Learning Objectives. Attendees will be able to:

1. Describe the range of memory and language deficits amenable to visual cues.
2. Discuss the evidence for the use of visual cueing systems for persons with dementia.
3. Describe a variety of visual cueing stimuli (memory books, reminder cards, letters, memo boards, etc.) for a variety of communication situations.


A note from the speaker
Rev. Dr. Jade C. Angelica

Alzheimer's Disease runs in my family. Both my maternal aunts had it, and my mother, who was diagnosed in 2001, died from Alzheimer's in 2011. As Mom's condition progressed, I knew that caring for her would be the most important work of my life. However, the opportunity for me to move from Boston to Iowa, where Mom lived, did not happen until 2007. While I was waiting to be with her, I honored Mom and what she was enduring by studying about Alzheimer's and identifying unique ways to communicate, connect and enhance relationships with people who have dementia. I ultimately created Healing Moments™.
