





Dear Nobles,

On June 6, 2026, Nobles of the Tunis Legion of Honour, Shriners and Masons alike will come together at the National War Memorial's Tomb of the Unknown Soldier to commemorate the courage and sacrifice of our Canadian Troops and Allies who landed on the beaches of Normandy to begin the liberation of France and Europe from the tyranny that had been devastating Europe for 5 years.

The Ceremony will start just before 1400hrs with form-up at 1330 hrs. Lunch and a dinner will be held at the Sgts and WOs Mess just a few blocks from the National War Memorial. Additional details can be found at tunisshriners.ca early in the new year. Note, the base hotel will be in downtown Ottawa. All registration is to be done through the Tunis office.

"Those who do not learn history are doomed to repeat it." The Life of Reason, 1905, George Santayana.

The following excerpt and photos (archives Gov't of Canada) say it all...

"On D-Day, June 6, 1944, Canadian troops from the 3rd Canadian Infantry Division and the 2nd Canadian Armoured Brigade landed on Juno Beach, a key part of the Allied invasion of Normandy. The 1st Canadian Parachute Battalion had also jumped inland earlier that morning, and the Royal Canadian Navy and Royal Canadian Air Force provided significant naval and air support, respectively. The Canadians faced fierce fighting, with 14,000 troops landing on Juno Beach, and suffered significant casualties, with 381 killed on that day alone. By the end of this campaign on August 25, 1944, more than 18,700 Canadians had become casualties. Canada's population in 1944 was 11.9 million."
