4	a Charles Kulp. Do you know who he is?

9	Q. It is to Colonel Clark, the District
10	Engineer.
11	There is also a notation down
12	there. Near the top, it says "Source."

- A. Information from the soil survey supported that information; the national wetlands inventory map which we reviewed, I'm not sure whether it was contained in this packet or something we reviewed from our own file, could have been either or both of those. Site photographs that verified observations that were contained in this letter --
- Q. Do you still maintain that material that you received from Putnam?
 - A. Yes; it would be in our file.
