CALL TO ORDER

Mr. Evans, President of Council, called to order the regularly scheduled council meeting at 7:30 p.m.

COMMENTS & CRITICISMS OF CITIZENS (6 minutes each)

Melody Farrin, 2826 McKelvey Road – Ms. Farrin stated that she is responding to the proposed "No Left Turn" sign at end of McKelvey Road. She stated that the issue is speeding on Brinton Road. The road is not safe from motorists and there are bus stops along the road, which are dangerous. She stated that police need to reduce speeding and that the route of Circle to Kings Road is marginally better. She asked for PennDOT to look into it.

Sgt. Taylor responded that there is no place for police to sit to enforce speeding.

Mr. Evans stated that they will look into alternative ideas.

Chief Helinski stated that it's difficult to enforce speed limit without radar (which is illegal for municipalities to use). The Borough is trying to secure the use of a radar sign from Edgewood. He explained that Brinton Road is a State-owned road, so Borough is limited on what they can do.

Albert Kvorjak, 2804 McKelvey Road – Mr. Kvorjak stated that he agrees with using electronic data to monitor safety on Brinton Road. He stated that since it's a State Road then we should have State Police involved. Also, get State Representatives involved and put pressure on them to install stop signs on Brinton Road.

Sandra Ellifritz, 2838 McKelvey Road – Ms. Ellifritz stated that speeding is worse coming up the hill along Brinton Road and that turning right only would be more dangerous. Also, residents on Circle Drive do not want the extra vehicles driving on their street. She suggested to Chief Helinski that driving up and down Brinton Road would be enough. She asked how many accidents are at the McKelvey Road intersection.

Chief Helinski stated that there are no accidents.

Mr. Kvorjak responded that there have been several vehicles that have been on the front law of his son's house located at that intersection.

Sgt. Taylor stated that the only way to enforce speeding without using radar is an electronic device that costs \$5-6,000. However, it needs 2 to 3 police officers to operate the system, which means that we would have to add another officer to a shift and use all three just to enforce speed on Brinton Road.

Chief Helinski stated that he is following up with other Boroughs for suggestions.

Ms. Farrin asked if we should call PennDOT.

Ms. Kvorjak stated that PennDOT did a survey a couple years ago. She suggested calling State officials Summer Lee and Jay Costa.

Mr. Evans noted that many residents think Brinton Road is the Borough's since we provide winter maintenance. The Borough has an agreement with the State and get reimbursed for salting and plowing their road. However, we don't have the authority to install certain signs.

Greg Barry, 574 Lorraine Road – Mr. Barry asked if the speeding equipment would be owned by other boroughs and available to use.

Sgt. Taylor responded that if the equipment was available, the officers would have to be trained to use it properly.

Carlos Sosa, 2819 McKelvey Road – Mr. Sosa noted that the attendance at the meeting shows the importance of this matter. He stated that the Borough should apply more pressure on the State. He noted that everyone band together and call their representatives to apply pressure on them.
