ADVENT SEASON

The season of Advent has a twofold nature: it is a time to prepare for Christmas, when we "recall Christ's First Coming among us, and it is a time when we look forward to Christ's Second Coming at the end of the ages. In this way Advent is a period of devout and joyful expectation" (General Norms for the Liturgical Year, 39). During Advent, each Sunday's Gospel reading has a specific focus. The Old Testament readings, especially those taken from Isaiah, are prophecies about the Messiah and messianic times. The selections from the writings of the Apostles present exhortations and instructions on different themes of the season.

Today's readings speak of peace. In the first reading from the prophet Isaiah we have a wonderful vision of what the world will be like on that day when "a shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse": "the wolf shall live with the lamb" and "the weaned child shall put its hand

"Prepare the way for the Lord!" Matthew 3:1-12

on the adder's den". Saint Paul in the second reading prays that we will "live in harmony with one another, in accordance with Christ Jesus". In the Gospel, we are called to "prepare the way of the Lord". As we prepare ourselves for the birth of the Prince of Peace, we are challenged to do our best in the 'here and now' to bring about the vision of peace proclaimed by Isaiah. We can begin by being peacefilled people with all whom we meet on a daily basis.

DECEMBER 8 - SOLEMNITY OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY:

On December 8, 1854, Pope Pius IX defined the doctrine of the Immaculate Conception as a dogma of faith. This dogma states that the Blessed Virgin Mary "in the first instance of her conception, by a singular privilege and grace granted by God, in view of the merits of Jesus Christ, the Saviour of the human race, was preserved free from all stain of original sin".

DECEMBER 12 - FEAST OF OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE. PATRONESS OF THE AMERICAS:

Today's feast commemorates the apparitions of the Blessed Virgin in 1531 at Tepeyac, on the outskirts of Mexico City. An imprint of her image was left on a cloak belonging to Juan Diego to whom she twice appeared. This cloak is an object of great veneration and is preserved in the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe, one of the major pilgrimage centres of North America. Devotion to Our Lady of Guadalupe has grown over the centuries, and in 1946 Pope Pius XII named her a patron of the Americas.

DECEMBER 12 - NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER IN SOLIDARITY WITH INDIGENOUS PEOPLES: Canadian Catholic Indigenous Council, founded by the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB) in 1998, proposes that the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe (December 12) be a National Day of Prayer in Solidarity with Indigenous Peoples. All are invited to join their Indigenous sisters and brothers in a special way this day through prayer and acts of solidarity

DECEMBER 13 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT LUCY VIRGIN, MARTYR: Lucy was born in Syracuse, Italy, and was martyred about 304. Because her name is derived from lux ('light'), during the Middle Ages people suffering from eye trouble began invoking Lucy's aid. She is also associated with festivals of light, especially in Scandinavia.
