A few words from your Board. We hope that you are all well and are surviving the Covid19. In an effort to keep our members informed as to what's happening at WWCDTC, we are sending this mini newsletter.

Unfortunately, we need to informing members that the Club will be holding off starting classes until the fall 2020 session in September.
