What you Should Know About P.A.C.E. (Police Athletics for Community Engagement). The primary goal is to build stronger relationships between neighborhoods and the officers patrolling them. At a time of "pay to play" athletics, inner city and at-risk youth are left out of these character building activities. P.A.C.E. is dedicated to offering athletics opportunities to at risk youth free of charge. No one is turned away. Core values are R.E.S.P.E.C.T. (Reliability, Enthusiasm, Sportsmanship, Positive Attitude, Education, Commitment, and Teamwork). In 2005, Latino Officer To-ny, concerned about South Omaha youth, organized six soccer teams. By 2016 over 1000 kids participated and in 2019 over 5800. Officers and teams are all over Omaha. By 2016 when P.A.C.E. was officially organized, South Omaha yath agraffiti had decreased 97%, gangs decreased 77% and shootings were down over 70%.

Programs have expanded to girls soccer and baseball, CrossFit training, KOPS law enforcement educational training camps, ACT prep classes, flag football, and cooperation with after school programs. Projections for 2020 were to reach 6000 kids, but the pandemic has brought additional costs. 98.5% of their budget comes from fundraising.
