

## "The Roots of Religious Liberty" "Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is liberty." 2 Corinthians 3:17

As American Christians we often trace our freedom to the First Amendment of the Constitution, which reads, in part: "Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof..." Our founding fathers understood the importance of religious freedom. It was no accident that they included the guarantee concerning religious freedom in the First Amendment and at the beginning of that amendment.

As Christians we would argue that religious freedom is a right whose origin is in God and in His image which we bear and in the Owner's Manual which He gave us. But as Christians we also owe an important part of our freedom to the Western history which can be traced back to the Roman Empire.

Christians were a minority religion in the first three centuries of Christian history. Some of the Roman emperors were severe in their persecution of Christians. Diocletian came to the throne in 284 AD. In 303 AD he ordered that all copies of the Bible be burned, that church buildings be destroyed, and that Christian worship be forbidden. A bit later he ordered pastors to be arrested.

In 306 AD Constantine came to the throne. He was not as severe. In the face of a rebellion the early church historian Eusebius says that Constantine had a vision in which Jesus told him to go into battle bearing a version of the cross symbol. At the Battle of the Milvian Bridge at the Tiber River near Rome Constantine and his forces defeated an army twice as large as his own. He remained as emperor until 337 AD.

In 313 Constantine issued the Edict of Milan which granted religious liberty to his citizens. That edict includes these words: "Perceiving long ago that religious liberty ought not to be denied, but that it ought to be granted to the judgment and desire of each individual to perform his religious duties according to his own choice, we had given orders that every man, Christians as well as others, should preserve the faith of his own sect and religion. ... We resolved... to grant both to the Christians and to all men freedom to follow the religion which they choose... And we decree still further in regard to the Christians, that their places, in which they were formerly accustomed to assemble... shall be restored to the said Christians, without demanding money or any other equivalent, with no delay or hesitation.... For by this means... the divine favor toward us which we have already experienced in many matters will continue sure thorough all time."

Such is the history of the religious freedom which we cherish. May we continue to enjoy it for decades to come.

#### Joy For Our Journey


March 1, 10:30 book study" Be Joyful" at Jenny's house.
