Tech Tips

Storage Tips

Here are two things for you to consider during the winter or long term storage

Breathable Barrier

You can quickly fashion a simple barrier to allow the top two inches of your windows to remain open for restricted ventilation yet provide reasonably effective protection for your car.

Simply roll up a length of rabbit wire into a tube shape, approximately two to three inches in diameter. Curl back any sharp barbs on one end. Then measure and cut the other end to fit snugly across the top of your windows.

A bit of "bending the wire fabric to fit" will be required-you don't want to crimp the windlace on your top. Do NOT roll your windows up too snugly. Be sure all wire barbs have been bent back with needle nosed pliers to avoid damaging cloth and bright metal surfaces.

No place some clean rags or old socks around each end to further prevent scratching. Then roll some old towels or other cloth around the wire tubes. Some additional towel material can be used to close any space remaining open at the back edge of the window.

Now roll the window up against the breathable tube shaped barriers. This "quick fix" is effective for both soft and hard tops and is very inexpensive! You can even insert a few moth balls or dryer sheets inside the wire tubes for extra protection.

Steering Column Collar

An item you may want to add to your list in prepping your Tbird for winter storage is to make sure to fully loosen the steering adjusting collar. Spray a bit of oil around the collar and slide the column several times. Be sure to lay some plastic on the floor to catch any drips.

As a lot of us know, these collars and columns seize from lack of use and they can be tough to loosen if they do.
