'Tis the Season

Bethany Reads

I have quite the stack of books on my nightstand pretty much all the time and, right now, many of them have to do with the gospels – you know - Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. One book, especially, has caught my attention, *How God Became King: The Forgotten Story of the Gospels*.

Author N.T. Wright invites his readers to rediscover the story that has been distorted through the centuries – the story of Jesus that he argues all four gospel writers were telling. To do this he reviews how the great creeds arose as a means of establishing orthodoxy (*right belief*) in the early church, and how the missing middle – Jesus' life and mission as described in the canonical gospels— has caused distortion in modern understanding of the gospels themselves.

I recommend this book for its balanced acknowledgment of differing, and often opposing, beliefs of people of faith in many different corners of tradition. Wright is respectful, but clear, about how Christians, in good faith as they've been taught and led in the church, have a watered-down view of what the gospel writers all proclaim.

His title pretty much spoils the ending for those who only want to know the "point"; if you want to know more about what God becoming king in Jesus the Christ means, this book may be a good one for you to read.

DEVON: "My mother was a single mother of 4 kids in Granada. At 12 years old, I had never received a Christmas gift before until I got the shoebox. We loved the slinky and the bouncy ball that lit up. It impacted my life in a marvelous way. I became more grounded in the church. I started to do children's ministry; then teach Sunday school; then youth leadership; then became president of the district youth council; then president of the National Youth Council; then at 22 years old the youngest senator in the history of Grenada. Then I went into starting churches in troubled communities. My shoebox wasn't just a gift-it was a life-changing experience. I received a tool to transform my life!"
