Unmasking Addiction

There is a sinister, and often subtle, slide that happens when individuals and families experience substance use disorder. Bringing out the truth of this disease is just one of the classes we teach at RecoveryWerks! to help clients understand how the disease progresses and how recovery happens. This article provides a brief overview of this education class.

The Sinister Slide of Substance Use Disorder for Individuals

The first phase is where the introduction to the substance occurs. Many people report later that they still remember their first experience and the powerful effect of their first substance use. In phase two, individuals may become preoccupied with substances and those around them may see increased rebellion. At this phase, many people will self-impose rules about the time, place, and type of substance they'll use. For example, "I'll only drink on Friday and Saturday nights when I'm out with friends". Moving into phase three, individuals tend to begin suffering losses in life, like failing grades or the loss of friendships. Often, having a 'good time' is defined through using and risk-taking and tolerance levels increase. The last phase of substance use disorder is characterized by needing substances to feel "normal'. Lying about consumption, using during work/school, and having difficulty facing the day with substance use are common.

The Sinister Slide of Substance Use Disorder for Family Members

Just as someone with untreated substance use disorder slides down through various phases, the entire family unit will experience corresponding phases of family illness. In phase one, family members gradually become aware of increased stress in the family which may result in increased arguments and tension. In phase two, family members may begin using defensive behaviors in an attempt to manipulate or control the substance user. In phase three, the family may feel helpless or experience feelings of guilt, shame, or self-blame. (continued on page 2)
