The **American Society of Tax Problem Solvers (ASTPS)** is a non-profit organization of tax professionals in the United States. The primary functions of ASTPS is to provide special training and accreditation to tax and legal professionals. Only licensed Certified Public Accountants, Lawyers, or Enrolled Agents may apply for full membership. Tax professionals without these advanced credentials are not eligible for full membership but may become associate members.

ASTPS directs CTRS (Certified Tax Resolution Specialist) examination and certification.

The primary function of ASTPS is educating CPAs, EAs, Accountants, and Tax Preparers on issues in regards to solving tax problems. Seminars and lessons plans are offered, online and live. Non-members may utilize these resources.
