#### Sen Grassley in Amana Monday

Senator Chuck Grassley visited Amana Monday afternoon taking a tour of Hotel Millwright and visiting with invited guests at the Carding Studio of the Mill.

As reported on local TV news Monday evening, the event was hosted by the Amana Society with board members and small business owners in what Sen. Grassley called a "town hall meeting with residents of the Amana Society."

In a four-minute interview posted by lowa News Now on YouTube, Sen. Grassley said it was "part of my 99 tour," so "I met here with employees - constituents here."

The Amana Society was advised that Sen. Grassley would like to hold the "listening post" meeting at the Carding Studio at Hotel Millwright to discuss agriculture, tourism and community issues. The Amana Society was asked to invite a number of people involved in those issues. The listening post which was not a public event.

Following the meeting in the YouTube interview Sen Grassley, stressed the importance of "total transparency" on the Epstein files, stating he has been asking for it for 6 years. He also discussed President Trump's negotiations with President Putin regarding the invasion of Ukraine and the importance of unity with Ukraine and our European allies.

This reporter was invited Sunday but was unable to attend Monday's meeting.

### **Amana Church Volunteers Return from Pine Ridge**

It was a busy, fulfilling and rewarding week of hard work and learning as Amana Church volunteers spent a week with Re-Member, the Lakota non profit organization, on the Pine Ridge reservation in South Dakota.

Living in bunkhouses and dining communally with other volunteers and Re-Member team members, the Amana volunteers spent their days building handicapped accessible ramps, building outhouses and working in gardens that share fresh vegetables for free to residents. Vegetables are delivered to the Porcupine village Post Office for anyone to pick up who needs vegetables. Over 50 pounds was delivered while the Amana group was there.

According to one volunteer who kept a journal, "On Wednesday all the groups worked together to replace stairs and 42-foot-long ramp at a trailer home in Pine Ridge. As we pulled up to do the work, we saw the Lakota woman who lived there slowly being helped down the stairs (of the trailer) to a car. She was unable to use the ramp because of its dilapidated condition. We were so happy to help by building a new

The volunteers also learned about Lakota people, their culture and spiritual traditions and attended a small, neighborhood powwow dance and horse race.

As the Amana volunteer wrote, "We have come to appreciate the difficulty of life on the Rez and see how people can face adversity with joy."

The Pine Ridge Reservation occupies the entirety of Oglala Lakota County, the southern half of Jackson County and Bennett County in South Dakota. The total land area of the reservation is 2.1 million acres. The reservation is among the largest in the United States. According to statistics from the US Census and ReMember, Pine Ridge has the lowest per capita income, \$8,768, in the nation and ranks as the poorest county in the country.
