Parched Pets



Is Your Pet Ready for Summer?

Anyone who has lived in Houston for any length of time knows our summers can be brutal! We must be more conscientious about our water intake when we are out in the heat. The same is true for our pets, but how do we know if they are getting enough water?

According to vets, many pets don't get enough fluids which can lead to health problems later in life. The consequences range from mild to life threatening conditions. Lack of fluid intake over time can lead to urinary tract problems, cystitis, bacterial infections, bladder stones, kidney damage, diabetes, and even tumors! Severe dehydration can lead to death.

How much should they get?

DOGS: According to WebMD, the recommended daily requirement for fluids in dogs is one ounce of fluid per pound of body weight per day. So, a 10 pound dog needs 10 ounces per day.

CATS: The daily intake for cats is more complex since cats can metabolize fluid from their food. The amount of water they get from food depends on their type of diet. If they eat canned food, it boosts their water intake. A good canned food should contain 65 to 78% moisture to provide enough fluid for your cat. In addition to canned food, fresh water is essential for good health. If your cat is on an exclusively dry diet, he gets much less fluid from the digestion of his food. Additional fluid intake is needed to meet daily requirements. The fluid intake of a cat on a dry diet should be higher --around 60% of the cat's weight.

Our pets give us so much happiness. Making sure they have the necessary diet, exercise, and water is important. It's the least we can do to ensure them good health!

Financial performance for CV continues to look good and get stronger as the Board remains diligent in its fiscal responsibility negotiating strong contracts for services but not at the risk of value erosion. Year to date through the first quarter, annual collections stand at almost 90% which is on par at this time of year. The performance indicators for the operating budget (pictured above) reflect steady state spend against budget showing a marginal surplus through March 31, 2014. COUNTRY VILLAGE SECURITY UPDATE:

Country Village contracts with Harris County/ Pct. 5 County Constables for 24/7 security. Constables enforce County laws but not city laws such as parking. **Constables have full arrest** authority. Pct. 5 works very effectively with the HPD. Country Village is part of a "Co-op" with other surrounding neighborhood associations in order to increase visibility and response time to resident calls.

No system is perfect. The importance of citizens being the eyes and ears of the community and reporting any and all suspicious circumstances, individuals etc., to Constables can never be overemphasized. In a severe event - robbery in progress, altercation, shots fired. etc. - call both the Constable and Houston Police 911. The Constables number is 281-463-6666.

Vacation Alert: If you are going on vacation you can also alert the Constables that you will be gone and they will run extra patrols by your home. Again, call 281-463-6666.

Never hesitate to call the **Constables for suspicious** circumstances partially described above. Constables will assess the situation to determine the degree of importance. Join the Country Village Website to receive current crime activity: cvhouston.com.

Security Do's and Don'ts

•Make your house look like you are home (leave lights on timers at night).

•Tell your neighbors when you are awav.

•If you're going on vacation, call the constables and schedule a vacation watch.

•Let a radio play or turn on a TV, preferably near the front door, throughout the day/night when not at home.

•Answer the doorbell if it rings but never open the door for someone you do not know. If something doesn't seem right, call the constables.

•Do not let newspapers, mail, flyers accumulate in your yard or on your driveway. Keep your lawn mowed. •If you have a doggy door, be aware that sometimes thieves will gain access to a house by crawling through it if it's large enough.

The above suggestions are not all inclusive. Use common sense and read security releases posted on the CV website. If you would like to have a security review of your home, call the Constables and they will do one for you at no charge.
