PARENT/TEACHER CONFERENCES



The following guidelines will help make your conference run smoothly:

- Conference sign-up sheets have been posted outside each classroom.
 If you haven't signed up yet, email your child's teacher for a time slot.
- Each conference is 15 minutes. In an effort to keep the conferences moving smoothly it is vital to adhere to the 15 minutes scheduled. Be on time or notify the office if you are running late for your conference. If you think you will need more than 15 minutes, you may make special arrangements with your child's teacher in advance.
- Conferences are for adults only and baby-sitting arrangements should be made for your child and/or siblings.
- Classes are held on conference days.
 Drop your child off in their classroom as usual and proceed to your conference.
- Make a list of questions and/or concerns. Bring your list with you to the conference to discuss with your child's teacher.

If you have any questions about the conference process or afterwards, contact your child's teacher or the office to discuss further or to arrange another date to meet.



IS THERE A RISING MCPS KINDERGARTENER IN YOUR HOUSE?



MCPS elementary schools need to know if your child will be attending their school in September 2018. To register your child, call your local elementary school. It is very helpful to the elementary schools to know the number of children attending for next fall as soon as possible. Based on projected enrollments your child's elementary school may need to add another class, add another teacher, increase class size, and/or close a class. While your child won't start school until September, the elementary schools are already making their staffing projections for the fall.


STAY AND PLAY UPDATES



Monday: The Artist's Corner By Mrs. McCullough

Love is in the air and in art class, we will be creating beautiful necklaces for our Valentines. Please read the books we created, plot line and illustrations are all originals (to right of the rainy day room doors). Happy Valentine's Day!

Our Bradley Bears are fending off the frigid February weather with some comfort foods. From homemade pancakes to savory bread pudding and crepes with Nutella and fruit, our chefs will practice measuring, blending, beating and folding with an emphasis on the process. January was all about the human body and some of its organs. We learned about the skin, the eyes, the ears, the heart and the lungs and how they work together to help us live. February will be our Physics unit. We will make a rocket balloon and learn about action and reaction which is the force that makes something move. Thursday: Where in the World is **Bradley Bear?**



Little Hands Music 2s, 3s, & 4s

Ms. Beth Reports:

We've moved from horse-and-pony-focused to dog-focused songs and activities. We met dogs of all shapes and sizes - Brownie, Rover, Bingo, and more! Drums have also been a highlight of recent classes. We explore loud and quiet, fast and slow, playing along to recorded music, and playing echo games with the drums. You can find some of the songs and poems about dogs on the album, "Ponies, Piggies, and Pups" available here to download from the Little Hands Shop.

Your child experienced the steady beat of the music while singing "Bow Wow Wow," bouncing a toy dog, and while playing resonator bars to the song. Partner dancing to "Bow Wow Wow" was also a lot of fun! This is a very simple dance that the children enjoyed in class! You might like to try it at home. Here are the steps: (holding hands, facing each other)

Bow wow wow (stomp, stomp, stomp)

Whose dog art thou? (nod, nod, nod)

Little Tommy Tucker's dog (turn around, turn around)
Bow wow wow (stomp, stomp stomp)

Most music has "form." Verses with a repeated chorus in between is a very common form. Some music is more complicated with several parts that repeat at less predictable intervals. To help your child hear and anticipate musical form we've enjoyed a directed movement piece in class to Beethoven's *Fur Elise*. Each part of the classical song has a specific series of movements. Now it's a fun mirroring game between teacher and children, but as we repeat this activity, the children begin to recognize and anticipate the different sections of the music and move accordingly!

Scientist Delfin Reports:

Winter is cold. There is snow on the ground. People live in warm houses, but what do animals do? This month in science, we will explore how animals survive the cold winter months. Whether it is birds migrating south or snow rabbits adapting by growing new, thick, white fur or big bears storing food and hibernating in caves, animals do many amazing things to get through the winter.



Science Class 3s & 4s



Mrs. Stevens Reports:

This month in Creative Movement, the children will jump, gallop, swim, and splash to the song I Feel Crazy So I Jump in the Soup. The children will swirl, twirl, spin and gallop with rainbow ribbons to the song Snowflakes Coming Down. I will introduce the parachute for the first time this school year. The parachute encourages the children to work together and utilize their listening skills.

Ms. Casey Sings:

Winter is wonderful! Despite repeated requests from the children for Halloween and Christmas songs, the colder weather brings new tunes revolving around snowmen, dressing warmer and Martin Luther King! We have some new faces in the 2's program and for them live music is a lot of stimulation! It won't take long for them to recognize the songs and to begin to engaging with their bodies and voices. The 3's classes are well in the swing of learning our Bradley Hills traditional songs and grooving to Elvis, The White Stripes, and Katrina and the Waves, and The Beatles to name a few. The 4's have fully embraced their senior position as the "big kids" at the nursery school and are confidently mastering more complex music, both contemporary and the classics. I can't imagine a more beautiful way to connect to children than through music.

Mrs. Cardoni Shares

In Spanish we finished up our lesson on our body (cuerpo). We have learned Spanish words for our body parts and can sing Head, Shoulders, Knees and Toes in Spanish (Cabeza, Hombros, Piernas, Pies) and dance the Hokey Pokey! We read <u>De la Cabeza a Los Pies (From Head to Toe)</u> the Eric Carle book translated into Spanish. In February we will be learning about feelings (sentimientos). The children will be singing <u>If You're Happy and You Know It</u> in Spanish but changing the words a bit to sing if you're happy (feliz)-clap (aplauda), if you're mad (enojado)-stomp (marcha), if you're sad (triste)-cry (llora) and if you're silly (tonto)-shout (grita). We will be reading <u>Asi Me Siento Yo (The Way I Feel)</u> by Janan Cain, a lovely rhyming book about feelings and <u>Como Dicen "Estoy Enojado" Los Dinosaurios? How Do Dinosaurs Say "I'm Mad"</u> by Jane Yolen. We continue to review all of the words we've learned and are amassing quite a vocabulary!
