But the same persecution is still in effect today, mostly in the form of imprisonment, for citizens of countries where there are no religious freedoms. Persecution.com is a website that features many people who are currently suffering for the cause of Christ, from imprisonment to utter abuse. In over 40 nations worldwide people are being imprisoned, tortured killed for their faith in Jesus a testimony for Him.

Many of the apostles of Jesus Christ were persecuted and killed after Jesus rose from the dead and the church was forming. Bartholomew was beheaded. James the son of Alpheus was possibly crucified. Andrew died by crucifixion. Peter died by crucifixion. Thomas was killed with a spear. James the son of Zebedee was beheaded. Philip was martyred in an unknown way. Matthew was killed with a spear. Thaddeus may have been crucified. Simon was killed by crucifixion (from about <u>-jesus.org</u>). It was the Jews and Romans who killed them, many times it was because of the rising of the church and the prosperity of Jesus' resurrection.

That same pattern has been carried down through the centuries until the present day. In many nations people are today being imprisoned for their fervent faith




Christ, but they continue to be a testimony for Him.

In <u>Numbers 22:1-20</u>, the King of Moab named Balak wanted to use God's prophet to curse God's people because they were his enemies. Balak had heard of the conquering of Sihon and Bashan by Moses and his people and Balaam was chosen by Balak to curse God's people. Balaam, however, was one of God's people. How then could Balaam bring himself to a curse?

As we read on in Numbers 22:21-35, we see that Balaam insisted on entertaining the wicked Balak's offer for status and riches just to have a conversation with him. But Balaam knew that Balak was God's enemy. Nonetheless he took a journey with his ass (donkey) and two servants to see Balak, and God sent an angel to stand in the way. Balaam's ass saw the angel but Balaam did not see him, and his ass tried to warn him by refusing to carry on. Balaam then hit the ass three times with a rod, and God opened the tongue of the ass so that it spoke to Balaam, asking him why he kept hitting her after she had been so dedicated to him all these years. Then Balaam's eyes were opened and he saw the angel. He repented to the angel of his desire to follow after Balak, but God instructed him to carry on to Balak regardless and to say the things He told him.

Balaam's disobedience in <u>Numbers 22:36-41</u> and <u>Numbers Chapters 23-24</u> was complicated all the more with the sacrificing of bullocks to impress Balak, and Balaam persistently came back to

God to ask him whether or not he should curse the children of Israel. And Balaam gave a complete prophecy as a result.

Balaam was never spoken of highly by other prophets of the Bible, and he was later executed for his persistence to chide with God concerning a curse on God's people.

Lot's Wife Looking Back at What She Lost

When Lot was traveling with his uncle Abraham, the great patriarch, they came upon a quarrel between their herdsmen. Abraham thought it best for them to part ways than to have the dissention, so Lot chose the well-watered plains of Sodom and headed that direction.
