On Friday, Carol Zuber, festival parade grand marshal, along with Gloria Alexander, Susan Hollrah and Sharon Grimm were honored. Saturday, Donna Trumpold, the late Terry Roemig, Susan Lockhart and Lisa Kokesh were honored.

Sue Lockhart, rural Marengo, and Lisa Kokesh, West Amana, as an energetic and upbeat team, have worked and volunteered more hours than can count to Amana's Oktoberfest, helping for many weeks at the Amana Meat Shop to prepare the bratwurst and in the food during the event. They have literally spent all weekend working in the tent or behind the scenes to make sure the festival food is good. They have also been ready and willing volunteers at many community events and are Amana's "go to" community volunteers whose expertise in the concessions has been a mainstay.

Gloria Alexander, Middle Amana, served as the "Kuchebaas" of the Oktoberfest tent for 20 years, working at both Oktoberfests held at the Market barn area before the festival was moved to the Festhalle. mobilize the merchant community to support Amana Oktoberfest and to volunteer. Susan, along with Tim Meyer, Des Moines, then owner of Tiny Tim's Christmas Carol Shop, and Barb Buchanan of Williamsburg then owner of Der Weinkeller, helped create the Tannenbaum Forest in the Festhalle as we know it today.

Sharon Grimm, Middle Amana, was among the very first in the original Oktoberfest Stage Show. She was a popular soloist and was part of a legendary all female choir that was part of every stage show. Her very first Bavarian dirndle is now part of the permanent collections of the Amana Heritage Society. Sharon was one of the founding members of the Colony Folk Singers which took the stage in the 1980s and 1990s. This singing troupe performed at the Quad Cities Germanfest and at events across the state. With her deep appreciation for music and lovely voice, Sharon has been a "Vorsanger" in the Amana Church all her adult life.

Donna Trumpold, was a vital member of the festival committee that managed the first Oktoberfests in Middle Amana and served as such for over 10 years. She, her husband, LeRoy, Reynold Moessner, Jim Reihmann and Cliff Trumpold were mainstays in that group and kept the festival going through some tough years, including four years back to back of terrible rain. Donna organized the ticket booth and spent weeks before and after getting festival details organized and bills paid. She was one of a core group who created the festival as we know it today.

Terry Roemig, who passed away last year, was a trusted advisor and dedicated volunteer for Oktoberfest for decades. She could always be counted on to volunteer and took an active, leading role in planning, as well as during the events helping wherever and whenever it was needed. She would literally drop her own work and go help in the Festhalle or anywhere as needed. Her dedication to brand and organizational ability were very important to festival success and Terry has been greatly missed this year.

Carol Zuber's many contributions were noted two weeks ago in the Bulletin, but we add here that she and all of these women and the volunteers they work with, have made Amana Oktoberfest the Iowa festival.
