TRASH AND RECYCLING GUIDE

The household trash that's left after you've removed the recyclables must be put out in a watertight, securely-tied clear plastic bag. Clear plastic bags may be purchased at local grocery and hardware stores. The bag must also be placed in a watertight trashcan, which must have handles and a secure cover. The trashcan cannot be smaller than 10 gallons or larger than 35 gallons, and the lid must be closed.

The Village will not pickup construction, demolition debris, furniture, tires, appliances, televisions, computers, auto parts, mattresses, bedsprings or fluorescent bulbs. The Village will not pickup yard waste, including soil, stones, garden rakings, animal waste, used motor oil, or soot from furnaces. For information on how to dispose of or recycle these items, please call the Sullivan County Department of Solid Waste at 845-807-0290 or a private hauler. Yard debris can be taken to the Village Water Works location located on Revonah Hill Road Monday through Friday from 6:30 AM to 2:30 PM. Yard debris consists of grass clippings, leaves, and limbs. No tree stumps allowed. All leaves in the fall must be raked loose, not bagged, to the curb before Thanksgiving. Any time after that, leaves will not be picked up. Keep in mind that the Village's equipment is a leafer; it is not a wood chipper. Do not rake leaves or yard debris into the street in the spring. It will not get picked up.

Each spring and fall, both the Town and Village, in conjunction with Sullivan County, conduct a clean-up week during which many of the above items may be disposed of at the Town Barn or Village DPW on Elm Street. The County also conducts tire amnesty weeks at which normal fees are reduced. The County, in conjunction with the Town and the Village, conducts spring "Litter Pluck" campaigns at which volunteers remove litter from the roadsides and the County waives tipping fees for disposal. The County also conducts a Household Hazardous Waste Collection Event each summer. Watch local newspapers for announcements of the dates for these special clean-up events. SCRAP METAL

The Village does not pickup scrap metal at curbside. However, the Village does maintain a dumpster at the Department of Public Works on Elm Street where Village residents and businesses may dispose of scrap metal for recycling free of charge. Hours when scrap metal may be brought to the Village dumpster are Monday through Friday 7:00 AM to 3:00 PM.

PICKUP SCHEDULES

All recyclables and trash must be put out at the curb by 6:00 AM on pickup days. They may be placed at the curb the night before. In the Downtown Business District, trash and recyclables must not be put out anytime from Friday night through Sunday afternoon. For Monday morning pickup they may be put out on Sunday night. This is to prevent piles of trash from remaining on the sidewalks throughout the weekend. Garbage cans and recycling bins should not be left out at the curb after they are emptied. If the Village does not collect recyclables because they haven't been properly prepared, they must be removed from curbside by 8:00 PM on the same pickup day. When a holiday falls on a Monday, all regular trash pickups for the rest of the week are changed to the day after the scheduled day. For example, regular Wednesday pickups will be made on Thursday. Please note that regular pickup days for recycling do not change after a Monday holiday.

Please follow the Village rules for Garbage and Recycling

GARBAGE

- Garbage must be put out at the curb by 6:00 AM on pickup days
- Receptacles should not be left out at the curb after they are emptied
- Household trash must be placed in clear plastic bags
- Trash bags need to be put in watertight receptacles and placed at the curb
- Receptacles should be no less than 10 gallons or over 35 gallons
- Receptacles must have suitable handles and tight-fitting removable covers
- Dumpsters must have tight-fitting covers and be in good repair
- The amount of trash should not exceed 3 receptacles per household otherwise the use of a dumpster will be required
- Receptacles and dumpsters must be easily accessible for collection (snow must be removed in the winter months and cars should not block receptacles)
- Acceptable: household trash, plastic bags, food, soiled containers, diapers, polystyrene foam, glass, ceramics, mirrors, plastic wrap, toys, food wrappers, garden hoses, and cat litter
- Not Acceptable: bulk items including furniture, mattresses, tires, computers, TV's, and appliances. Household hazardous waste, liquids, car batteries, yard waste, electronics, textiles, scrap metal, batteries, motor oil, and fluorescent bulbs. RECYCLING

- Recyclables must be put out at the curb by 6:00 AM on pickup days
- Recycling bins should not be left out at the curb after they are emptied
- Recyclables must be separated from all other garbage and placed in a bin or garbage can labeled recycling
- Recyclables must be rinsed out and cleaned
- Please do not use plastic bags for these items because they contaminate the recyclable
- Cardboard boxes must be broken down. Bulk cardboard must be bundled and tied together with string or twine
- Acceptable: glass bottles, cans, plastic containers, newsprint, books, magazines, junk mail, paperboard boxes, cardboard, aluminum foil, milk and juice cartons, brown paper bags, 5 gallon buckets, and shredded paper in clear bags. These items can be commingled together in your recycling bin
- Not Acceptable: household trash, foods, liquids, foam products, medical waste/sharps, plastic bags, glass, ceramics, light bulbs, cat litter, soiled paper, and toys
