The Truth About the Irish Potato

Although the potato was imported in the 17th century, it is a symbol of Ireland and its undisputed hospitality. In addition to this, as a staple of the Irish diet, it has been considered the unofficial mascot of the Irish food scene throughout history. This is mostly due to its role during the Great Famine in Ireland, during the 19th century (1845 to 1849), when the potato crop failed, leading to widespread plight and mass emigration among the Irish community. Irish people use the potato in many famous recipes, such as Irish stew, potato bread, and, of course, the famous Tayto Crisps. The potato is a central food of Irish life.
