Dear Departed



Parashas Shemos

The parashas Shemos will be read in synagogues on the 21st of Tevet (January 18) 2020/5780. In this reading Shemos (Numbers) the second book of the Torah, starts out with the names of the 20 people who emerged from Jacob's loins. Joseph was in Egypt and was second only to Pharaoh in esteem. It is concisely a conjunction that relates to the conclusion of Genesis (46:8). In fact, the opening phrases of Shemos and Genesis 46:8 are the same. (Shemos 1:5)

The narrative of the exile continues during which "Joseph died and all his brothers and that entire generation. The children of Israel were fruitful, teemed, increased and became strong-very, very much so; and the land became filled with them." (1BID 1:6-7).

A new king arose over Egypt, who did not know Joseph. He said to his people, "behold! The Israelite people are much too numerous for us. Let us deal shrewdly with them, so that they not increase" (1BID 1:8-9) and join forces with our enemies". He then orders that all the Israel male children be drowned at birth.

Other events in the Parasha are in the following summary:

- 1. Four month old Moses is put into a Basket and set into the Nile River
- 2. Moses is saved by Pharaoh's daughter
- 3. Moses kills an Egyptian who was beating an Israelite and flees for his life to Midian.
- 4. G-d speaks to Moses out of a burning bush and tells him that he and his brother Aaron will liberate the Israelites from Egyptian slavery.
- 5. Pharaoh imposes hard labor upon their Israelite slaves who built the cities of Pithom and Raamses. Jews did not build any pyramids.

Significant Concepts and Values:

- 1. <u>Justified civil disobedience</u>—The Hebrew midwives Shefra and Puah refuse to carry out Pharaoh's command to kill male Israelite babies. This was due to their fear of G-d. They believed in the sanctity of life and that there is a higher power than Pharaoh who make moral demands on human beings. This is the first recorded case of civil disobedience in defense of a moral cause.
- 2. <u>G-d is seen differently by each generation</u>—When G-d reveals Himself to Moses at the burning bush, G-d calls Himself—"I will be what I will be." (Shemos 3:13) Every generation conceives of G-d differently, and in every age G-d is likely to reveal Himself n new ways. In the Amidah prayer G-d is called G-d of each of the patriarchs who saw G-d in a different way.
- 3. <u>Humility</u>— When Moses is called by G-d to return to Egypt to lead the Jewish people to freedom, his first response is a question. "Who am I that I should go to Pharaoh and free the Israelites from Egypt?" (Shemos 3:11-12) This was showing true humility. For true humility to G-d is answered by Micah when said that what G-d requires of us is to do right, love goodness and walk humbly with G-d (Micah 6:8).
