The Redneck Country Club, known for its

delicious smoked ribs and warm atmosphere,

has proudly served its smoked meat, famous

cheesy potatoes and other sides since 2004.

Located on the Phelps' family ranch on High-

way 131 just north of Holden, the Redneck

Country Club, owned and operated by Jack

and Pat Phelps, first began selling their ribs on

Saturdays at the Farmers' Market, sponsored

by the Holden Area Chamber of Commerce,

when it first began in the summer of 2004. As

word spread about the tasty ribs, each week

visitors to the market would be waiting in the

parking lot before Jack and Pat would arrive

with their smoker, and they would quickly sell

out of all their ribs. Not long after that, Jack

and Pat started selling their smoked ribs from

their driveway on the weekends. They placed

their smoker out in front of their house on the

driveway along 131 Highway. The aroma was

too much to pass up, and people would stop

After a few months, people started asking if

Jack and Pat would cater their events. Thus,

the idea was born for Tiger Jack's catering.

Thier first catering event was the Holden Area

Chamber of Commerce Banquet. Though

Tiger Jack's started in their home, they soon

realized they needed to construct a building

just for their catering business. In 2006 they

and buy a slab of ribs.

built a building d i r e c t l y behind their house. People would drop by and ask to buy ribs and sides. Then people started asking if

they could come out there to eat, so they added a room in front just for seating in 2007. The rooms are warmly decorated with a fireplace and memorabilia from the past - old signs, license plates and records, a framed collection of barbwire types from the past and, of course, University of Missouri's Tiger pennants, banners and signs (Jack claims to be Mizzou's #1 fan).

Shortly after that, the Phelps developed an 18-hole sand-green golf course on their farm open to the public. Jack says, "As long as there is daylight, you can golf. No hours are posted. You are on the honor system. People just put money in the box." In 2007 the first golf tournament was held at the golf course. Jack and Pat, Holden High School alumni, have always taken great pride in hiring local high school students to help them maintain their grounds, as well as help cut their cherry and hickory wood to smoke their meat.

The memorable name for the golf course and clubhouse, the Redneck Country Club, and their catchy slogan, "where the elite meet to compete," is hard to forget. In 2010 the idea of forming Redneck Country Club members' club began with just a few of the regular golfers. Today over 120 members have joined, with half of the members admitting they don't even play golf. They just want to be a member of the Redneck Country Club and proudly wear one of a collection of t-shirts displaying the logo.



In 2009 the Redneck Country Club started hosting special events such as the Nace Brothers, many local bands and the Michael J. Laferty Band of South Padre Island, Texas, at their outdoor amphitheater with eats, entertainment and lots of fun. Today there always seems to be a crowd at the Redneck Country Club whether it is a group gathered to watch football or basketball, people golfing or playing horseshoes or washers, kids playing miniature golf or a special event going on. The Redneck Country Club hosts numerous events throughthe year: banguets, wedding out

receptions, family reunions, class reunions, graduation parties, birthday parties, Christmas parties, funeral dinners, golf tournaments, as well as school cross country district and invitational meets. The Redneck Country Club has always been a great supporter of the Holden Area Chamber of Commerce, as well as many other community organizations, including the Holden school athletics, donating and serving ribs at the 2012 State Football Playoffs when the Holden High School Eagles played in the Final Four game.

Born in Ottawa, Kansas and currently residing in Kansas City, the singer/songwriter grew up soaking in the sounds of Randy Travis, Garth Brooks and George Strait. "I remember buying Randy Travis' Storms of Life on cassette tape," he recalls with a smile. "Garth has been a huge influence on me because he's such an entertainer. He does a great job of singing to his fans, not at them. These days, I'm really influenced by guys like Keith Urban and Eric Church, who are both great storytellers. That's my goal with my music. I want to tell great stories and entertain people."

Marvin does just that on his new EP. "Simple" is an engaging anthem about establishing priorities, relishing the truly important things and remembering, "the secret to life ain't that hard." "Life really is simple," Marvin says. "Don't over think it. Don't complicate it. People tend to just make life so hard when really, it's not

ever. We should just live life to the fullest and have fun doing it. You only get one chance."

The affable singer/songwriter has a gift for making up

tempo tunes sound even more vibrant and he's equally skilled at wringing every ounce of emotion from a tender ballad such as "Why I Like Dreaming," an angst-ridden song that finds an

abandoned lover reminiscing about the days before he was left behind. "Hanging Out" is a potent mid tempo number about that comfortable place that is just good

including "Love Revival," an upbeat celebration that showcases the sense of fun in his warm, rich voice. "Love Revival' is a Travis Marvin curve ball," the country traditionalist says with a laugh. "It's kind of 70ish with a pop/disco groove. It's really different for me, but fun. This song was primarily written to help people enjoy life whether it be with family and friends or who-

for your soul, which was inspired after a night on the town in Nashville's honky tonks. The lively "Never had a First Time" captures the excitement of a burgeoning relationship in all its delicious glory while "Untied" is a summertime anthem that paints a picture of a perfect day with someone special.

"I've been blessed with a talent to be able to connect with people pretty quickly. I love looking at people's eyes. I love looking at them, not through them," says Marvin, who is doing 200 shows a year. "I've always been a people person. I love making people happy. I guess it's in my blood."

Always a natural performer, Marvin graduated from family, school and church functions to performing at events throughout Kansas. After placing second in a Battle of the Bands contest, Marvin was approached by legendary radio programmer Mike Kennedy of Kansas City's KBEQ, who recruited him to open a show for Lee Ann Womack. "Ever since then, it's been nothing but escalation," says Marvin, who has opened for Luke Bryan, Miranda Lambert, Blake Shelton, Tim McGraw and Kenny Chesney. "We've just kept climbing the ladder because I've been fortunate enough to have really good musicians around me. They push me to be a better lead man and a better artist. They are loyal guys, very talented musicians and just good people."

Marvin is appreciative of the opportunities he's been given and is excited about the future. "I believe that everybody's got a story and the easiest way for me to tell it is through country music," he says. "You can sing a

slow song that will tug at your heart. You can sing a fast

song that will make you forget about all of your p r o b l e m s . Everybody's got challenges in their lives but country music helps take people away from them for a while. That's why it's


where I need to be. That's my purpose in life. I want to be able to share my life and my stories with people through music."


K9 Boss is a dual purpose working dog that is trained to detect the odor of illegal narcotics, track and locate items, and apprehend suspects. K9 Boss is also a member of the Johnson County SWAT team and is utilized in many different high risk situations.

Deputy Watkins has been with the Johnson County Sheriff's Office since 2015 and has been the K9 handler since 2018. Becoming a K9 Handler requires intense training that included a 6 week training course with K9 Boss and continued training at a minimum of 16 hours a month. In addition to his work with Boss, Deputy Watkins is also a Drug Recognition Expert for the state, a Field Sobriety Instructor, and he handles the maintenance and training of the breath instruments operated by deputies. He also works to obtain state grant funds to operate traffic enforcement campaigns within Johnson County.

When off-duty, Boss lives with Deputy Watkins, his wife, their five-year-old daughter, and their three other dogs.
