2022 Year In Review

Winter, 2022

2022 was a very busy year in the Village. There were 3 major projects completed in the Village.

The main Project was the bridge replacement with a culvert. The project was funded by grants from Alberta Transportation & Alberta Municipal Affairs.

Also, 72% of the streets in the Village were paved this summer, funded by AB Municipalities capital grants & Summer Village surplus. The balance of the streets will be paved when we have enough grant money to cover it.

Project #3 was a Boat Dock installed in the lake at the end of TWP RD 594.

There were 5 new property owners in 2022 and there were also 6 development permits issued in 2022.

After 2 years of not being able to hold public meetings or have social gettogethers, council enjoyed meeting Village residents at our AGM and at a Public Hearing. More events will be planned for 2023.

Sometimes they are training new drivers and it takes them a couple of trips to learn our roads.

Brush Burning & Open Fires

Residents should be aware that fire permits are required for open fires and brush burning.

The procedures for acquiring a fire permit for Summer Village residents have been worked out with the County of St. Paul and the Mallaig Fire Department. If you light a fire that creates a lot of smoke and someone calls the fire department, you will be charged for the call-out if you do not have a fire permit.

If you want to burn brush or have an open fire, please call the Village administration, Norman Briscoe, at (780)645-4677. Fire pits and BBQ's are not considered open fires and do not require a permit.
