## BOB R. STERNBERG 1918 - 1996

Bob R. Stemberg, 77 of East Lansing, a native of Elkton and former local vocational agriculture teacher, died Tuesday, March 12.

He graw up on the family farm north of Elicion and graduated from Elicion High School, Class of 1936, then attended Ferrie State University and Michigan State University. After serving in World War II he returned to MSU for graduate studies under the GI Bill. He taught vocational ag in Owendale and Pigeon and was a junior-servior high school principal in Quincy, until joining the Michigan Department of Education as a consultant. While working in vocational ag he also pioneered in the field of dairy and beel artificial insemination.

Mr. Stemberg was a pioneer in Michigan Driver Education Laws, 1955-1954. His responsibility at the state department included substance abuse prevention education, and he was consulted by many schools experiencing a crisis in student problems. He reared in 1962. He was a member of the World Future Society and a life member of the National Education Association and the Greater Lansing Area Retired School Personnel.

Surviving are his wile Louise of East Lansing, a son, John (Catherine) Stemberg of Arvada, CO, and grandchildren, Christine Anne and Robert James Marshall of East Lansing, Aaron Lei and Sarah Minda Stemberg of Arvada, CO.
