

California Home School Sports League Guidelines and Rules

1. A team, school, or organization may join the league by entering a team(s) and following the rules listed below.
2. All member schools/teams agree that this is a Christian Home School League
3. All members are encouraged to enter teams in more than one sport.
4. All teams will be allowed a maximum of two practices per week.
5. Teams will share costs equally for rental fees, referee fees, and other general costs.
6. Registration Fees:
To help with master scheduling, results, web site updates, and fair amount of games please pay the following fees to CHSS, 2750 Vine Norco CA 92860
 - Volleyball: \$30 per team, due by Aug 15th of current season
 - Basketball : \$50 per team, due by Oct 30th of current season
 - Baseball: \$30 per team, due by March 31st of current season
 - Softball: No fee, as this sport is in the development stages as a league
 - Track & Field: Fee included in track meet fees
7. Season Enrollment and Rosters:
Players enrolling on a team must be members as of the following dates to be able to participate in the remaining part of the season or any end of the season tournaments.
 - Volleyball: Sept 30th
 - Basketball: Jan 31st
 - Track and Field: April 15th
 - Baseball/Softball: April 15th
8. A team cannot have a player play on their team if he/she is a member of a home school organization that has an active team in their age division for that particular sport.
9. Players cannot play on different school teams in one season. For example one cannot play on a public or private school team and then play on a home school team in our league.(Seasons: Volleyball and Cross Country – Fall, Basketball – Winter, Track and Field, Baseball and Softball – Spring); Exception, they may play on a recreational or church league team.
10. A home school athlete eligible for league play is one; who is taught at home by his parents, grandparents, older sibling of at least 18 years of age, or legal guardian at least 51% of the time.
11. The percentage of classes that are taught at someone else’s home or a central location by someone not listed in number “10” above must not be more than 50% of the courses being taught for each individual athlete.
12. A player is not home schooled 51% if; they are enrolled in multiple classes that are in a non-home-school setting. Such as; public school, private school, or college courses. These courses must clearly be less than the 51% of the home-schooled courses.
13. Home schooled does not mean college classes, vocational classes, private school classes, Christian school classes, or public school classes.
14. It shall be considered illegal for any home school organization or team to, for the purpose of participating in athletics, recruit a public or private schooled child by setting up a situation where the child would be taught by another home school parent.
