PALMETTO CLUB HISTORY

1894: Thirteen women met at the home of Jane Weeks to organize a reading circle and play whist. 1895: Twenty-six charter members organized the Palmetto Club in response to the Women's Club Movement then sweeping the country. The Club motto was chosen, "Why Stay We On Earth Unless To Grow". Green and Gold were selected as club colors and the Palmetto leaf was chosen for the club emblem.

1896: The Club federated with the Florida Federation of Women's Clubs and the General Federation of Women's Clubs.

1917: The Club paid for the Public Recreation Director, the start of the present City Recreation Department. The Club also paid for the first City Planner and organized the League of Women Voters in Florida.

1971: The Clubhouse was destroyed by fire.

1972: The present Clubhouse was built.

CLUB MILESTONE:

1947 – 2017: Over \$700,000 has been donated to the American Cancer Society.

The Palmetto Club was the first building in Daytona Beach to have electric lights. Early projects helped rid the street of hogs and other livestock and started the first free lunch program and helped prepare lunches for underprivileged school children. The Club spearheaded the YWCA and PTA.
