ORDINANCE NO. <u>25-04142025</u>

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A PERMITTING PROCESS FOR TEMPORARY DUMPSTERS AND PORTABLE STORAGE CONTAINERS PLACED ON PUBLIC PROPERTY IN THE VILLAGE OF RICHWOOD

WHEREAS, the Council of the Village of Richwood, Ohio, desires to regulate the placement of dumpsters and portable storage units on public streets and rights-of-way to protect public safety, preserve infrastructure, and maintain orderly appearance within the Village;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Richwood, Union County, Ohio, that:

Section 1. No person shall place, or cause to be placed, any temporary dumpster, roll-off container, or portable storage unit on any Village-owned street, sidewalk, or right-of-way without first obtaining a permit from the Village of Richwood.

Section 2. The Village shall establish a dumpster permit application process, including application forms, conditions of approval, and a schedule of fees. The Village Administrator or their designee shall be authorized to administer the permitting process and may update the procedures and forms as needed.

Section 3. All permits issued shall be subject to conditions intended to prevent damage to public infrastructure and to ensure timely removal of such containers. The Village may impose time limitations on placement and may allow for extensions upon request and payment of an additional fee.

Section 4. Any person placing a container in violation of this ordinance, or failing to comply with the terms of a permit, may be subject to enforcement action and penalties as a minor misdemeanor.

Section 5. The Village Administrator or their designee may grant exceptions to the requirements of this ordinance for properties that are physically unable to comply, provided such exception is granted in writing prior to placement of the container.

Section 6. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force at the earliest time permitted by law.
