POWER STEERING BELT

Does your Thunderbird power steering pump set level? According the Restoration Manual the pump for the 55-57 Thunderbirds should set level in the engine compartment. When you look at other Thunderbirds and pictures in books and magazines, most often the pump is tilted. So how do you get the pump level? In most cases it is all in the length of the belt. The correct belt listed for the Thunderbird is a Gates 9405. Most auto parts stores can convert that number to the brand they sell. In some cases the Gates 9405 will not level the pump. I have heard one owner state that he used a NAPA 17403 to flatten the power steering pump on his 'Bird. The best method to level your pump is to have the sales person at your friendly parts store sell you 2 or 3 belts of different lengths with the understanding that you will return the ones that you cannot use. It is also a good idea to check the pump with the belt off. Some owners have said they find it nearly impossible to pull the pump level even with the belt off.
