

Kolter, Anthony

Anthony "Andy" Kolter, 84, of Caseville, died Thursday morning, Dec. 19, 2002, at Berti's Nest Adult Foster Care Home in Bay Port while under hospice care. He was born Feb. 23, 1918 in Detroit to the late Anthony and Mary (Wallace) Kolter. On July 22, 1942, he was united in marriage to Patricia DeBeau in Baltimore, Md. Andy served in the U.S. Army during World War II as a military policeman guarding German prisoners of war. In the early 1950s, he moved to the Thumb area. He settled in Elkton in 1955 where he was employed at Active Industries. He retired in 1979 and then moved to Caseville. His wife preceded him in death on Sept. 16, 1996. He was a member of St. Roch Catholic Church in Caseville, the Knights of Columbus of Caseville-Pigeon and former member of the Caseville Eagles. Surviving are his two children, Mike DeBeau and his wife, Sue, of Lapeer and Patricia Everett of Texas; nine grandchildren; 19 great-grandchildren; and brother, Edward Kolter of Bay City. A funeral mass will be conducted at 11 a.m. on Saturday, Dec. 21, 2002, at St. Roch Catholic Church in Caseville. A Knights of Columbus Rosary Service will began at 7 p.m. tonight at the Champagne Funeral Chapel in Caseville.
