**Grace & Peace**  
from the Pastor's Desk

*Three Bible verses have been significant to me during my lifetime: Jeremiah 29:11, Philippians 4:13, and Colossians 3:17. I've leaned on these verses during difficult times in my life and through the working of the Holy Spirit, they have given me strength, renewed my faith, and kept me moving forward. I am still amazed that God gives me words to live by before the need to put them to use.*

There was a point in time when I was discerning if I should continue on my path in seminary. I was reading the book of Jeremiah when I came across the verse "For I know the plans I have for you. Plans to give you hope and a future." I latched onto that verse with a hope in a future of serving God. I saw the same verse in a frame at my seminary friend's home when I was dog sitting. It seems a lot of seminary students use that verse for strength and discernment.

In my first pastorate I led Vacation Bible School studies and was introduced to the verse, "I can do all things through Christ who gives me strength." I definitely get my strength from Christ, and in the most trying of times this passage got me through. And, again, it is a very popular Bible verse to those who trust in God to get them through.

Surprisingly the verse that kept me moving forward in one of the churches I was serving also came from VBS; this time I was leading the music portion of the week and the catchiest song was a variation of the verse "And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him." I hope the kids remember the message of this song and put it to use in their lives.

And a verse that has also been important is Hebrews 10:23 "Let us hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who has promised is faithful." It reminds me that Jesus lived and died for each of us and we can believe God's promises because God is faithful. 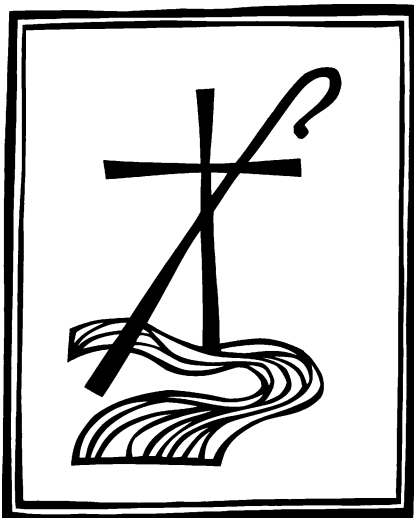
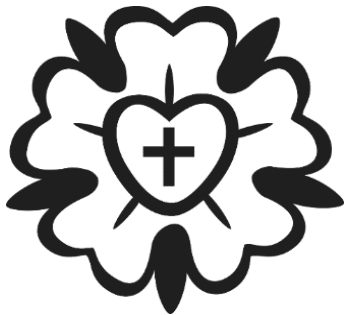

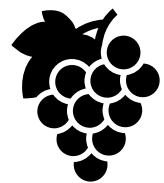
We held our 1<sup>st</sup> planning meeting for this

## SEASON OF CREATION

As followers of Christ from around the globe, we share a common call to care for creation. We are co-creatures, and part of all that God has made. Our wellbeing is interwoven with the wellbeing of the Earth. We rejoice in this opportunity to safeguard our common home and all beings who share it. This year, the theme for the season is **Listen to the Voice of Creation**. The Season “Celebration” **begins on 1 September, the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, and ends on 4 October, the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, the patron saint of ecology beloved by many Christian denominations**. This year we will unite around the theme, “Listen to the Voice of Creation.” The Psalmist declares, “The heavens are telling the glory of God; and the firmament proclaims God’s handiwork. Day to day pours forth speech, and night to night declares knowledge... their voice is not heard; yet their voice goes out through all the Earth, and their words to the end of the world.” (19: 1-4) During the Season of Creation, our common prayer and action can help us listen for the voices of those who are silenced. In prayer we lament the individuals, communities, species, and ecosystems who are lost, and those whose livelihoods are threatened by habitat loss and climate change. In prayer we center the cry of the Earth and the cry of the poor. May this 2022 Season of Creation renew our ecumenical unity, renewing and uniting us by our bond of Peace in one Spirit, in our call to care for our common home. And may this season of prayer and action be a time to Listen to the Voice of Creation, so that our lives in words and deeds proclaim good news for all the Earth.

**Plastic is difficult to avoid, but as long as consumers keep purchasing it, sellers will continue to use it. Here are a couple of ideas that can help limit plastic in your daily routines.**

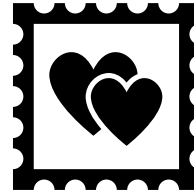
### **Limit plastic packaging**

The best way to deal with plastic packaging waste is to avoid it. Consider not only dollar savings but also **look for savings that helps the earth.**

- Use tap or filtered water and dispense into a reusable bottle rather than buying water in single-use plastic bottles.
- Purchase produce that isn't wrapped in plastic, e.g. bulk mushrooms, loose fruits and vegetables, etc. Bring your own reusable bags to place items in. There are lots of options available. Search “reusable produce bags” to find ones you like.
- Rather than buying individual servings of yogurt for lunches, purchase the largest size you can then parcel out portions at home into reusable containers.

### **Make your toothbrush kinder to the environment.**

Choose a bamboo toothbrush to avoid adding to the landfill plastic. Or support a business that creates new toothbrushes (and razors) from plastic collected from coastlines and waterways to keep it from polluting the ocean.
