GENERAL RULES OF ENTRY

1. All exhibitors must have adequate public liability insurance.
2. All trophies to be held for **one year only** and to be returned **CLEAN** 21 days before the 2026 show.
3. Cars requiring to park in the wagon park will be charged £15, car park £10
4. All entries to be taken online www.hambletonshow.com, entries close 11th May 2025, from 12th May entries will be double fee, no entries to be accepted after 17th May. No postal entries or entries taken on the day
5. If the show re-schedules its show date (usually due to adverse weather conditions) the entry fee will be refunded less an administration cost of 25%, the secretary must have a request of refund **BEFORE** the new show date, under no circumstances will a refund be given after the new show date. If the show is completely abandoned, refunds will only be given upon receipt of an SAE addressed to the secretary, the entry fee will be refunded less an administration cost of 25%. SAE must be received within 28 days of the cancellation.
6. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to check if the show is still taking place due to bad weather.
7. Entry fee **WILL NOT** be refunded if the horses, owners or riders are not correctly registered with the relevant societies before the show day, or if the incorrect class is entered online.
8. All prize money, prizes and cups to be collected on the show days, nothing to be sent out after the show days.
9. **CHAMPION OR RESERVE CHAMPION PRIZE MONEY WILL NOT BE GIVEN OUT UNTIL AFTER THE SUPREMES. To be collected from secretary's tent on the day of the show.**
10. The organisers reserve the right to refuse any entry.
11. The organisers reserve the right to cancel or amalgamate any classes.
12. No responsibility will be accepted by the organisers for accidents or damage to riders, competitors, spectators, owners or animals or any other property.
13. The decision of the judge is final.
14. Hard hats must be worn at all times when mounted, whether competing or not. Please see BSPS Rule 43 regarding all BPS classes.
15. Any objection or protest must be made in writing to the secretary accompanied by a fee of £50 which may be forfeited to the show funds in the event of an objection being overruled.
16. **No litter is to be left on the showground. CLEANING OUT OF HORSEBOXES AND TRAILERS IS STRICTLY FORBIDDEN**
17. No nomination or substitute entries will be accepted.
18. Under no circumstances is any animal to be exhibited under a judge who is known to have bred, leased, sold or produced that animal.
19. **All grooms entering the ring must be correctly dressed and must wear a hat in the ring.**
20. Entry fees will only be returned (minus 25%) with a valid vet's or doctor's certificate **BEFORE** show day
21. Prize money: For all ridden and In-hand classes prize money will be awarded as follows. Three entries or less 1st prize only, four or five entries 1st and 2nd Prize and 6 or more entries as per schedule.
22. **RULES FOR RIDDEN SPORTS HORSE AFFILIATED CLASSES.** It is strongly recommended that competitors aged 18 or over wear Correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats that meet one of the following current Safety Standards: All PAS 015; VG1; ASTM F1163 04a onwards; SNELL E2001; AS/NZS 3838 2003 onwards. It is mandatory for competitors under the age of 18 to wear such skull caps or hats. In the jumping phase of working hunter classes the aforementioned skull caps/riding hats must be worn. No earrings to be worn when competing in the Sports Horse GB affiliated classes, and horses must be shod on all four hooves.
23. All horses and ponies entering the Showground **must be vaccinated**, and vaccination certificates / passports must accompany the horse or pony to the Show and be available for checking. Un-vaccinated horses, or those exhibitors unable to produce a passport on request will be prevented from competing and will be asked to leave the showground. Entry fees will not be refunded.
24. In the event of inclement weather we politely request that there is no lunging on the show field.

THE PRICE FAMILY SUPREME IN HAND HORSE OR PONY OF THE YEAR

The following class is a qualifier for the Price Family Supreme In-Hand Championship, NEC, Birmingham, 8th - 12th October 2025. The objective of the competition is to find the supreme light horse or pony in-hand

champion of the year, irrespective of breed or type (excluding heavy horses).

The Champion horse or pony from the following classes will be eligible to compete, provided it has not already won a qualifying round in 2025.

CH12 Irish Draught, CH28 CHAPS, CH41 Miniature Shetland, CH42 Standard Shetland, CH43 TO 46
WPCS, CH47 PB WPCS, CH48 & 49 M&M, CH53 Show Pony, CH54 Show Hunter Pony, CH56 Cleveland Bay.

If the Champion has already qualified for Horse of the Year Show 2025 or is ineligible, then the Reserve Champion of that section may come forward, provided it has not already qualified and is eligible. If both Champion and Reserve Champion have already qualified for Horse of the Year Show 2025 or are ineligible then the section will not be represented in this qualifying round. Foal champions are not eligible. In the event of a horse/pony having been awarded more than one section Championship at this show,

that horse/pony will represent both/all sections and the qualification will not pass down to the Reserve Champion in the 2nd and any subsequent sections.

There will be no direct entry into Supreme In-hand Championship Qualifier, all animals must be a section champion or reserve champion (as applicable).

Irish Draught Sport Horses/Part bred are horses that have a minimum of 25% proven Irish Draught breeding

- MARES with foals at foot, 3 years and over must be inspected and classified as Class 1 (or RID), Class 2 or Supplementary Grade Up (or AID)
- Youngstock must be the progeny of a Graded Mare (Class 1, Class 2, RID (GB), AID or Supplementary Grade Up Register) and be by a Class 1, 2 or RID (GB) stallion on the Irish Draught Breed Register.
- Pure bred ID and ID Sport Horse / Part bred, 3 year old colts must be un-inspected o All 1, 2 & 3 year old colts must be bitted and shown by experienced handlers over 18 years of age
 - All pure-bred Irish Draught Stallions
 - must be inspected and overstamped by the IDHS (GB) and be Class 1, 2 or RID (GB).
- Stallions must display a red, white and blue ribbon in their tails and be shown by experienced rider/handlers over 18 years of age • Ridden horses must be 153cm (15hh) or over.

RIDDEN HUNTERS

Sports Horse Breeding of Great Britain require ALL exhibits in classes 2 to 16, 11 & 19 to 34 to be registered with the society. The Hunter classes are run in accordance with the rules of the Sports Horse Breeding of Great Britain 2025 **Day Ticket = £42** (this entitles competitors to compete at a maximum of 2 shows in the year at £42 per show – it covers owner and rider membership together with horse registration for that show). If the class is a qualifying class for (R.I.H.S), in order for the qualification to be valid, application for full owner/rider membership and horse registration must be received in the SHB(GB) office within 14 days. - (ii) Receive remuneration, whether it be monetary or goods in kind, for employment in the connection with horses in showing livery/production, teaching or coaching, (instruction at Pony Club and Riding Club excepted). This Rule does not include the suppliers of ancillary services in equestrianism, such as farriers, vets, therapists or administrative office roles.
- (iii) Show a Horse owned or sponsored by a company or a commercial firm or show a Horse for which his/her immediate family accepts showing livery production or training charges, from a person outside the immediate family concerned, in any showing classes, Sport Horse Breeding (GB) or otherwise.
- (iv) Act as a Brand Ambassador, in any showing classes, Sport Horse Breeding (GB) or otherwise.
- (v) A competitor is not eligible to compete in Amateur classes on an Exhibit, which has been ridden by a Professional Rider in ANY class, Sport Horse Breeding (GB) or otherwise, with the exception of Working and Side Saddle classes, during the current year and the following year, up to and including the Royal International Horse Show.

NOTE: Novice horses ridden by a Professional before the 1st January 2025, will not be affected by the rule changes, and therefore will be eligible to compete in Amateur classes during the 2025 Show Season".

(The above Rule, 3e(v), does not apply, if the Horse has been Professionally Produced and ONLY ridden by a Showing Professional, during the previous season, or if the horse has subsequently been sold and re-registered under new Ownership).

- (vi) If you ride/compete equines on a regular basis, which you do not stable at home, your Amateur status will be reviewed by the Board/Council, i.e., if you ride / compete multiple equines or ride regularly for one or more owners, you could be deemed professional.

For guidance, it has been determined that a perceived/potential conflict of interest could arise in the event that an appointed judge has a previous or current connection to a horse entered in the competition. Examples of such connections and interests include, but not limited to, the following. The judge has; bred or previously owned the horse or acted as an agent in its sale; previously competed, trained or kept the horse at livery; previously or currently had a financial or other interest in the horse. In the event that a judge/owner/rider (or their agent) knows of, or should know of, any potential and/or perceived conflict of interest in a horse entered in the competition they must declare this to the Organiser as soon as it is known. Steps will be taken to manage it as practically as possible. Any potential conflicts will be written and displayed next to the scoreboard. Conflicts at the Final will be avoided and managed by Burghley Horse Trials.

SECTION II Jumping: NO time will be allowed between these sections for any adjustment to tack or rider's dress.
(40 marks) Maximum height of fences 0.90m (4 years) 1.05m (5 years). **Fall of horse or rider or a total of 3 refusals will result in elimination.**

Note: fence height at Final 1.00m (4 years) and 1.10m (5 years).

SECTION III Potential to Lengthen Stride: immediately after the jumping the 5 year old horses will be required to gallop. The 4 year olds will only be required to lengthen the canter indicating they could learn to gallop with further development and maturity.

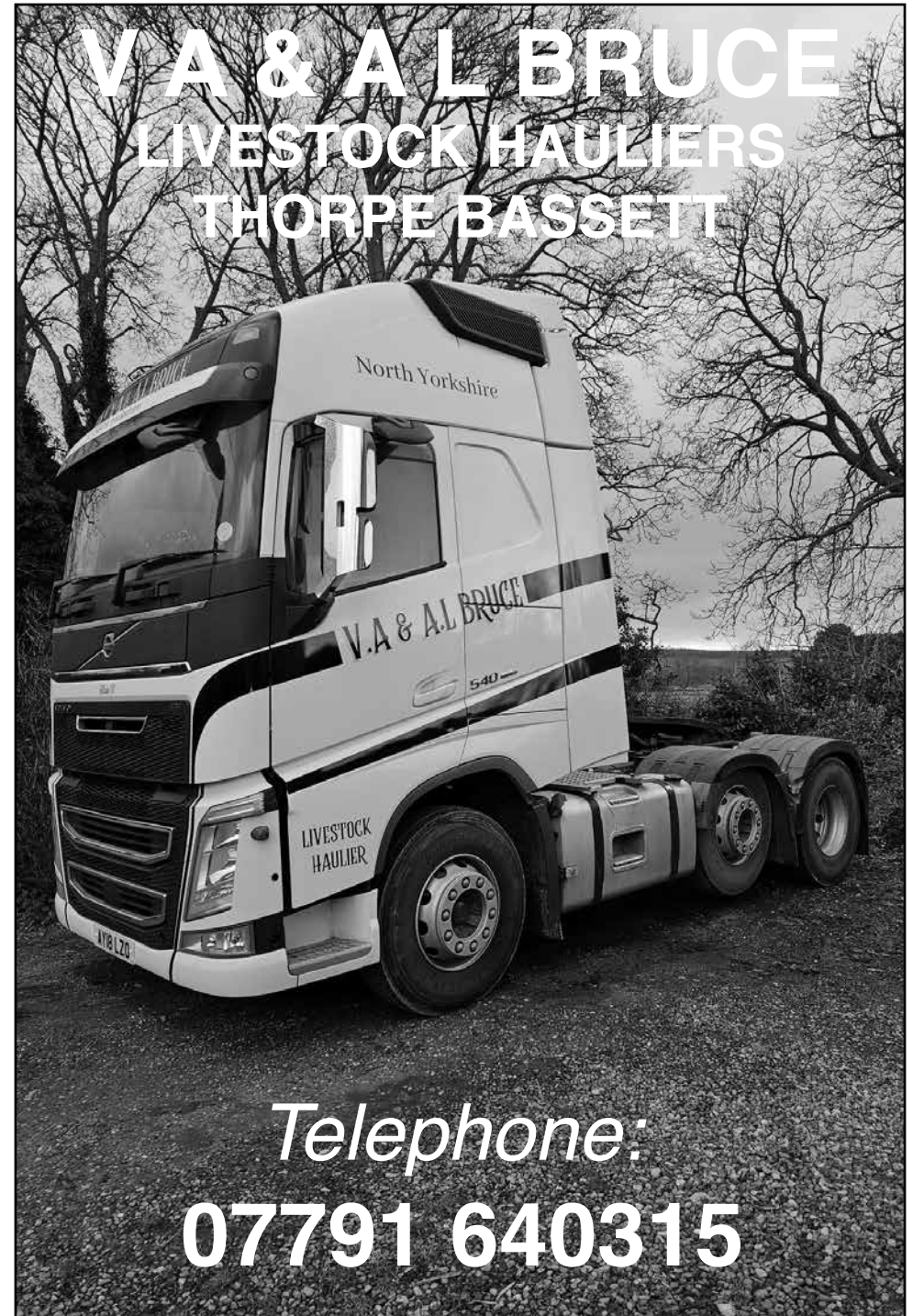
