### The Reverend's Ruminations - August 2024 (June-July Recap)

Greetings, family & friends of First Congregational UCC!

Here we are at the edge of August, and the first 2/3 of summer seems to have flown by — so much so that I didn't get a "ruminations" article into the July newsletter amid my activities and travels. I've made a bit of a photo collage on the next page, but to recap some of the big events of my summer thus far:

In June I officiated three graveside services for Veterans in our area (different from my usual participation in the Legion/VFW honor guard, where I often present the flag to family members) as well as organizing and leading the annual memorial service at the American Legion 2nd District meeting — which was hosted here in Fairmont this year. Unfortunately, I also officiated Becky Phillips' funeral here at First Congo, as we celebrated the many church and community friendships that gave her life such joy.

The last week of June brought five days of Annual Training with the 133rd Airlift Wing, during which we were evaluated on our readiness to complete various tasks that could potentially be involved in a deployment to areas such as Guam, the Philippines, or other islands in the Pacific. My Religious Support Team and I travelled to both Camp Ripley in north-central MN and Volk Field in west-central WI aboard the unit's C-130 cargo planes to visit and offer spiritual support to our Airmen setting up operations at these "islands." Several times during the week we found ourselves donning chemical protective gear (gas masks, coveralls, gloves, & overboots) to simulate continuing to work in areas where biological or chemical attacks were imminent or had occurred — not a fun way to operate in any temperature!?!

Annual Training week led directly into a "normal" drill on the last weekend of June, and on the 29th I received my promotion to Lieutenant Colonel in a small ceremony at the base chapel, attended by my entire family and a close friend since middle school. I was especially happy to have my parents there, since all my previous Army promotions have been in other states (or even other countries). With this promotion I will now serve as the Wing Chaplain for the 133rd Airlift Wing, managing 2-3 other Chaplains and corresponding (enlisted) Religious Affairs Airmen as we provide for the religious and spiritual needs of about 1,200 Wing members. I am honored to continue this valuable work to military members from across the state as an extension of our ministry together here at First Congregational UCC!

During the middle week of July, three members of my chapel team and I attended a week of training at Joint Base Lewis-McChord near Tacoma, WA. We received instruction in two different marriage enrichment / relationship enhancement curriculums that we plan to implement among the squadons of our wing in the months ahead. It was a valuable time of instruction as well as an opportunity to fellowship and network with Religious Support Teams from across the Reserve and National Guard components of both the Army and Air Force.

I pray that after a VERY rainy start, your fields and basements are dry and these summer months have provided opportunity for rest, relaxation, family time, and maybe some much-needed outdoor projects!

**COMMITTEE REPORTS:** We are still looking for a Vice Moderator.





### Hy-Vee & Fareway Report as of 21 July 2024

During the last 9 weeks, \$29,697.80 (14.85%) worth of Hy-Vee slips were received. After 33 weeks, Hy-Vee is at \$125,372.13 (62.69%) toward the  $17^{th}$  goal which is now \$200,000.

During the same time, \$11,638.53 (7.76%) worth of Fareway slips were received. After 68 weeks, Fareway is at \$77,524.86 (51.68%) toward our  $5^{th}$  \$150,000 goal.

This program started the first of March 2011, so any slips from then until now can be used. Any Fairmont Fareway and Hy-Vee food store register slip can be used. Even slips from Hy-Vee Fast & Fresh (Gas), Coffee Shop, Food Service, and Pharmacy help us toward the goal. Delivery slips/ sheets can also be used. Thanks to all who bring/mail the slips to the Church, or mailing them or dropping them off at my house.

# **Burgundy Beef**

### **Ingredients:**

1/4 C. flour

1/2 tsp. salt

1/4 tsp. pepper

vegetable oil, shortening

2 lb. beef stew meat

1 tsp. minced garlic

l bay leaf

1 tsp. dried marjoram, crumbled

1/2 tsp. dried thyme, crumbled

l C. chopped onion

1 1/4 C. dry red wine

1 (10.5 oz) can beef broth

1 1/2 C. small whole frozen onions, thawed

1/2 lb. fresh mushrooms, sliced

Cooked noodles

Cornstarch & water-optional



### Directions:

Combine flour, salt and pepper in a plastic bag. Add the meat and shake to coat. Heat small amount of oil in a Dutch oven; brown beef on all sides in small batches. Stir in the minced garlic, bay leaf, marjoram, thyme, chopped onion, wine and beef broth. Simmer covered for 1 1/2 hours. Add small whole onions and mushrooms and simmer 20 minutes longer. Remove bay leaf. Serve over cooked noodles. The long cooking time ensures tender beef. If a thicker sauce is desired, dissolve 1 Tablespoon cornstarch in 1 Tablespoon water. Stir mixture into the beef and cook over medium heat, stirring constantly until thickened.
