

Evening 4 – Hanukkah, Chanukah (Wednesday)

12.25,2019

Significance: Remembering the re-dedication of the Temple after it was defiled by the Greeks

Observances: Lighting candles, reciting prayers and scriptures

Length: 8 days – December 22-30, 2019

Customs: Praying, eating fried foods; playing with a dreidel (top)

The Torah reading for each day of Hanukkah is taken from **Numbers 6:22-8:4**, which recounts the dedication of the *mishkan* (temporary, moveable place of worship) by the Israelites in the desert. On Shabbat during Hanukkah, we read the regular weekly portion. During the Festival of Lights, the *Haftarah* readings, additional selections from the Prophetic books, are **Zechariah 4:1-7** and **I Kings 7:40-50**.

For Wednesday, we light the Lead Candle (shamash) and then we light the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, candles from right to left and say:

(Candles are added from right to left and kindled from left to right.)
