From the Desk of David

What an exciting time to be at Christ the King! God has entrusted us with so many blessings. Mother Theresa once remarked, "I know God will not give me anything I can't handle. I just wish that He didn't trust me so much." I know that this quote rings true of our staff, vestry, and congregation.

While God is blessing us with a vibrant and growing congregation, God has entrusted us to serve in new ways here at Christ the King. Practically speaking, this means new people will be needed to serve in leadership roles in order to accommodate additional programming. The real challenge is finding ways to support existing ministries while being open to new ones. We need to ensure we have enough people to serve as Sunday school teachers, servers, lectors, and so on before we begin a new ministry. I know we can do this.

I encourage you to read Rosemary Sullivan's article about newcomer ministry at Christ the King. In that article, she describes the hope that we can establish a children's chapel program for the 10:30 am service. This would require 2 adults to teach each week, on a rotation basis. A rotation ensures that no kind soul is sucked into a new ministry and is stuck there for 35 years. Seriously, I once met an organist who "volunteered" to play one Sunday back in 1973. Even though she did not want to do it, she continued to "volunteer" every Sunday until 2008! I think this example reflects well on her generosity but poorly on how that parish honored her gifts.

Another ministry possibility is starting a children's choir. Our organist/choirmaster, Drew Balog, said we need at least 8 children to make this viable. I look forward to seeing what happens as we walk with Christ together.

Here is a reminder about some upcoming events:

Wednesday Evening Program: "A Shepherd Looks at Psalm 23."

We will read and discuss this book and close with worship (Compline). Program runs from Sept 14 to Oct 19. 6:30-8:00 pm. Snacks provided.

Confirmation Class

Successful newcomer ministry is currently a primary objective of our Diocese, and it is absolutely one of the vestry's and Father David's primary focuses for Christ the King. As part of its commitment to newcomer ministry, the Diocese is taking applications for grants to support parish newcomer initiatives. To take advantage of this opportunity, Father David and the vestry are joyfully working on an application for a three year grant, which would include funds for a designated staff person. This person would be hired from within our own parish to oversee newcomer ministries and would be trained and supported by a Diocesan newcomer ministry We will submit Christ the King's application shortly, and the Diocese expects to make final decisions on the award of grants by November 2011.

While we are very excited at the prospect of a grant to allow us the luxury of a designated newcomer coordinator, we are already undertaking several newcomer oriented endeavors, which include the following:

- 1) Father David and the vestry participated in a day long vestry retreat focused on newcomer ministry and facilitated by a Diocesan trained coach;
- 2) Concerted efforts by Father David and the vestry to meet all newcomers and to ensure they sign the guest book;
- 3) Emphasizing that the vestry person of the day is available to assist visitors in any way they may need:
- 4) Praying for each month's newcomers at each vestry meeting; and
- 5) Creation of tri-fold brochures to highlight various aspects of our church life, including the steps to membership at Christ the King, lay ministries, service organizations, Christian education, youth

group, outreach ministry, and music ministry.

We have also invested in newcomer bags to give to each new family who visits the church. These are reusable grocery bags bearing Christ the King's logo, and in them are a water bottle, a sticky note pad, and a pen, all with Christ the King's logo, as well as a children's coloring book and a pack of crayons. We are very excited about this new initiative and to kick it off, on Rally Day, we are giving every parish family a bag with goodies to enjoy!

Probably our most exciting newcomer project arose out of Bishop Doyle's meeting with the vestry during his March 2011 visit to Christ the King. In discussing the growth objectives of the church, Bishop Doyle emphasized the importance of bringing into the church and sustaining the attendance of families with babies and young children. This discussion highlighted to the vestry the necessity of offering a nursery to accommodate children from infancy to age three or four, as well as a children's chapel for children who are a bit older.

So, we are thrilled to announce that Christ the King's nursery will open on September 11! We have extended offers of employment to two nursery staffers, and our offers have been accepted by both. As soon as all is finalized, we look forward to introducing them. The nursery will be available every Sunday during the Sunday school hour and the 10:30 service.

While we are not in a position to begin a children's chapel immediately, our goal is to establish a children's chapel program when we have the volunteers to do so. This would take place during the 10:30 service between the Gospel hymn and the Peace. The children would

start the service with their parents, leave for children's chapel after the Gospel hymn, and return to the service for the Peace. Father David or Rachel Shaye would love to visit with any anyone interested in spearheading or participating in this program!

We are blessed by the newcomers we are seeing each week. We pray that our words, actions, and deeds toward them reflect the love of Jesus Christ, and that Christ the King will be a place they wish to make their church home.

School is back in session and so is Sunday School at Christ the King. However, we need everyone to look deep in their hearts and pray about giving a couple of extra hours to lead a class. The class time is 9:15 am on Sundays and you would need a little preparation time to review the curriculum. Please consider investing a couple of hours of your time each week to enrich the lives of our children by taking part in this very vital and important ministry. If you have not noticed, there are children everywhere around the church these days and we need to ensure that they have a place to learn about the Bible.

There are 168 hours in a week. If you were to tithe your time to the church you would need 16.8 hours! Now figure that we are only asking for an additional 2 hours for Sunday School teachers. That would be a fairly good bargain. Please consider helping in some capacity.

There are quite a few people that spend extra time doing things for the church, which could be considered for the time tithe, such as serving on the vestry, altar guild, choir, yard crew, additional committees, etc. Have you ever considered being a part of one or more of the groups? Sometimes it seems that the same few people do the bulk of the work. Although we know this to be true in some cases, we also know that behind the scenes there are numerous people that contribute without ever having any recognition whatsoever.

We thank everyone for what they offer to Christ the King Church, and we ask you to look deep into your hearts and pray for guidance on how you may offer some additional time for our growing community. Time, talents and treasures all working together will enable our parish to continue "To be a light, living as a witness in Christ's love, serving and nurturing all."

In closing, please mark your calendars for Saturday, October 15th, at 6 pm for our Commitment Dinner and kick-off to our Stewardship Awareness month. We will have a wonderful meal and brief table discussions on what stewardship is all about, and we will revisit our 'Ripe for the Harvest' campaign. Please plan to attend this event and share food, fellowship and discussion on how we can offer back to God what He has given us.




