REVOLUTIONARY WAR CLOTHING & ACCOUTREMENTS

We would like to thank you for your interest in the MS SAR Color Guard. This guide will endeavor to help you get a kit together so that you may get active with us.

The MS SAR Color Guard will always let each member choose the uniform they want. Many want to wear what their ancestor probably wore. We ask that you be as accurate as possible. Several of us just got the Continental Infantry Privates coat from Townsends. Just be sure it is wool. PLEASE don't get the coat made out of nylon/synthetic material. Natural Fibers breathe easier and look better. Most of us are wearing thigh length black gaiters over our breeches. This helps to create a semi-uniform look. You can expect to sink about \$1,000 into a good uniform.

Many want epaulets, so many are Officers. But with so many Officers, we end up with Generals carrying muskets or flags, under the command of a Captain. Officers carry swords, not flags or muskets. A good-looking Color Guard will have two (maybe three) Officers. The rest are militia or enlisted soldiers.

Having said that, do what you want. We will welcome you, even as a militia soldier (Schenk). Again, thank you for wanting to join. You will look great. We NEED you!!

The MS SAR Color Guard can supply 8 Bayonet's w/ Scabbards. We also have four Charleville muskets with bayonets. However, if you own a Charleville or Brown Bess musket, please bring it.

There are many different uniforms during the Revolutionary War. These include civilian clothing, militia, Hunting Frocks and the Continental Line uniforms. Most companies that sell Continental Line uniforms sell the dark blue coat with red facings and cuffs. However, on October 2, 1779, General Washington issued a General Order creating a Uniform standard. While uniforms were hard to come by, Officers were "endeavor to accommodate their uniforms to this standard.

This standard stated:
