

Dr. Dockery is Board Certified in Foot and Ankle Surgery by the American Board of Foot & Ankle Surgery and is Board Certified in Podiatric Orthopedics by the American Board of Podiatric Medicine. He is a Distinguished Practitioner in the Podiatric Medicine and Surgery Division of the National Academies of Practice. He was voted "One of America's 175 Most Influential Podiatrist" of 2006 and voted as "Movers and Shakers: America's Most Influential Podiatrists" in 2012, by the Podiatry Management Magazine Editors & Advisors. He has published more than 140 scientific articles in peerreviewed medical journals and he founded the International Foot & Ankle Foundation for Education and Research in 1979 and is currently the Chairman of the Board and the Director of Scientific Affairs of that organization.

ROBERT W. GIERING, MD, MS is a board certified physician in both Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation and Pain Management. He is currently the medical director and owner of Taconic Spine, a spine center of excellence in Manchester Center, Vermont. Dr. Giering specializes in developing optimized nonsurgical treatment options for spine and chronic pain conditions.
