THE SLOVENIAN CATHOLIC CENTER'S ONGOING RESPONSE TO COVID 19

Dear Members and Friends of the Slovenian Catholic Center,

I hope that you are all continuing to stay healthy and safe during these rapidly changing times.

The ongoing COVID-19 virus continues to create uncertainty in all of our lives; the last 6 months have definitely been profoundly unusual! Perhaps no other crisis will define our legacy more than our response to this virus. It is with this in mind, that the Board of Directors has established an SCC Re-opening Committee. The Committee meets on a regular basis to review and analyze the risks and options of re-opening our Dom.

Holy Rosary in October – October is devoted to Mary and to the prayer of the Holy Rosary. The prayer will take place at St. Mary's at 10:30 AM before the start of Sunday mass.

All Saints Day, **November 1**st – This year All Saints Day falls on a Sunday. Mass in Slovenian will be held at 11:00 AM as usual. November is the month of prayer for the deceased.

Advent starts November 29th and unperishable food items will be collected in the church all throughout Advent for the Christmas basket for the needy in the area.

The Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, patronal feast day of the United States of America, on **December 8**th is a Holy Day of Obligation and Slovenian Mass will be celebrated at 11.00 AM.

Christmas – Masses will be said at midnight and at 11:00 AM in the Slovenian language. At 7:00 AM Mass will be said in English.

New Year – On the New Year Eve at 6:00 PM and on New Year's Day at 11:00 AM Mass will be held in thanksgiving for the past and praying for blessings in the New Year.

Retreat House

The wheelchair lift is functional and has passed all inspections. Blessings to all who contributed! We just finished replacing the siding on the top level. It was deteriorating and causing leaks in the second-floor hallway ceiling.

This week we are replacing all the outside doors. They were original to the 1949 construction and the frames were rotting. They are being replaced with fire compatible steel doors and frames with panic bars and locks. We are using this downtime to do a deep clean of all the floors. On the first floor outside rooms, we removed the shelves and sheeting that covered the radiators. Precision Plumbing came in and replaced all the old valves with petcock shutoffs, so we can now turn off the water in small sections to work on the sinks which need to be refastened to the wall.

Many thanks to Karl Hren Sr. and Gary Woodman who continue to paint. Volunteers are welcome. We can ensure proper social distancing!

Baraga Days

By the time you receive this, Baraga Days will have occurred. They were supposed to be in Lemont and in Joliet, but Covid restrictions prevented that. The BBA decided to move it to the internet with Bishop John Doerfler celebrating the English Mass in his Cathedral at 10:30 AM Eastern on Sunday, September 20^{th,} and Fr.
